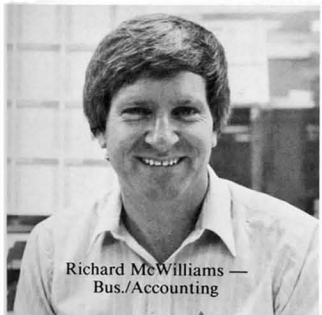

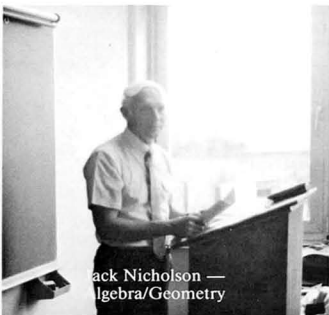


Anne of Cleves — English
