Former Stripper Named Denver Sports Editor

DENVER (AP)—Blick Lucas, 37, former Stars and Stripes assistant sports editor, has been appointed sports editor of the Denver Post.

He succeeds Lee Meade, recently named assistant to the commissioner of the American Basketball Association. Lucas, a graduate of the University of Minnesota, left the Stars and Stripes and joined the Post in 1962.

Bethesda, Md., the youngster most thought couldn't make it as a pro because of his size (small), fired a final round two-under-par 70 to finish behind the top three with a 72-hole total of one-under-par 287.

At even par were Ray Floyd (70), George Knudson (70) and Bobby Nichols (72). Jack Nicklaus took a double bogey on the 18th and finished with a 73 for 289 while Arnold Palmer had a final round 71 for 294.

After making the turn in the final round with a three-over-par 39, Pott bogeyed the 10th and parred the 11th to fall behind Casper and Devlin. Then began his march as he birdied the 12th, 16th and 17th to catch the front-runners at the wire.

"I couldn't get momentum earlier," said Pott, "but that birdie on the 12th was great

because it finally got me going."

Casper and Devlin earned paychecks of \$7,800 each. A week ago Casper won the non-PGA Southern California Open and \$6,000 and now has \$13,800 for the year.

There has been only one other playoff in Crosby history and that was in the snow in 1962. Doug Ford beat Joe Campbell in that one.

Jack Rule had a closing round 72 to finish all alone at 290 while Dale Douglass (70), Miller Barber (71), Dave Hill (72) and Englishman Tony Jacklin (73) tied at 291. The 292 group was made up of Bob Smith, who had the final day's best round, a five-under-par 67, Kermit Zarley (70), Wes Ellis (71), Richard Martinez (71) and PGA champ Don January (72).

Madrid Sweeps Rota, Boosts Record to 6-0

MADRID (Special) — The Madrid High Knights maintained an undefeated league record and notched their fifth and sixth Spain Division victories here Friday and Saturday with 69-61 and 50-46 triumphs over the Rota Admirals.

Neither game came easy for coach Lee Mawby's charges as they had to stave off strong fourth-period Rota rallies.

In Friday's game, the Admirals and Knights battled to a 17-17 tie after one quarter. The hustling Knights returned with a 21-point second period to gain a 38-26 halftime advantage.

Madrid, with Juan Acosta and John Wood carrying most of the scoring load, opened a 56-35 lead after three periods but a deter-

mined Rota exploded for 26 points in the final quarter, cutting the Knight victory margin to eight points.

Acosta led the Knights with 22 points followed by Wood with 18 and Vic Castro with 13. Bruce Bell led Rota with 25.

In Saturday's contest, Acosta dumped in seven points in the last 2½ minutes to put away Madrid's victory.

The host Knights had struggled to a 22-21 lead at halftime and could keep only a three-point lead, 34-31, after three periods.

Acosta again led Madrid in scoring with 14 points, 13 in the second half. Bell, a 6-foot-2 forward, paced the Admirals again with 17 points.

FRANKFURT (Special)—Frankfurt's Eagles, romping twice over Nuernberg, ran their USDESEA Blue Division record to 4-0 here over the weekend, winning 87-45 Friday and 82-54 Saturday.

Frankfurt got off and winging fast in the opener as Bernie Smith hit five baskets and Steve Bari four—for eight of his 13 points—in the opening quarter and Nuernberg was never in contention.

Frankfurt's defense, after allowing 20 points to Nuernberg in the second quarter, clamped down in the second half giving up but 13 points after intermission, only five in the last quarter. Coach George Austra substituted freely in the second quarter and throughout the last half.
