Warriors Nip Conn Despite Smith's 50

WUERZBURG, Germany (Special) — Ken Smith's 50-point barrage wasn't enough for Conn here Sunday as the Wuerzburg Warriors edged the Crusaders, 80-77, in a Marne Conference game.

Mike Delaney led Wuerzburg with 24 points while teammates Bill Foreman and Augusta Adams contributed 18 and 17, respectively.

Behind Smith's awesome total on the Conn side was Nate Walker with 11.

The Warriors are now 3-5 in league play and Conn is 2-4.

WILDFLECKEN, Germany (Special)—The Wildfleckens Wild-

cats jumped into a tie for third place in the Marne Conference here Sunday by handing the second-place Graves-Ready Cardinals an 83-80 defeat.

Stallions Record Pair of Triumphs Over Heidelberg

LUDWIGSBURG, Germany (Special) — Dave Flaherty's 40-foot basket with two seconds left to play gave the Ludwigsburg High Stallions a 46-44 victory here Saturday and a two-game series sweep over the Heidelberg Lions in Blue Division competition.

The Stallions won the first game of the series handily, 71-59, and now have a 3-3 record in league play while Heidelberg has lost all four of its league starts.

Ludwigsburg had to overcome a 39-36 deficit in the final quarter to pull out its thrilling Saturday win. Tom Delaney missed on a one-and-one foul situation for the visitors with 27 seconds to go and Flaherty's long shot netted the win. Heidelberg managed only five points in the crucial fourth period while Ludwigsburg scored 10 to come from behind.

Friday the host Stallions hit 50 per cent of their shots from the field and led virtually from start to finish. It was 38-28 at halftime and Ludwigsburg was

never seriously pressed.

Mig Oyola was the top scorer in both games for the Stallions. He had 19 in the opener and 13 in the second game. Flaherty had 11 points Friday and 10 Saturday while Bill Park netted 10 and 9 on the respective days.

Four players hit double figures for Heidelberg Friday. Delaney set the pace with 17 while Foster Fountain and Bruce Wood had 11 apiece and Bob Bissell 10. The next day Geof Schatterman was top gun with 15 while Fountain added 13.

The junior varsity teams split in their two-game series.

U.S. Pilot Suffers Serious Injuries In Bobsled Crash

ST. MORITZ, Switzerland (AP) — Boris Said of Dorset, Vt., suffered multiple injuries, including a broken shoulder and a brain concussion, Sunday in a bobsledding accident during the four-man European championships won by Switzerland.

Said, pilot of USA III, was injured seriously when his sled was hurtled off the track at Tree Corner, a particularly difficult bend midway down the icy mile-long Olympia run.

The 36-year-old contractor was rushed to a hospital where officials reported he also suffered facial cuts and eye injuries.

The other three members of the sled team—David Dunn of Elm Grove Wis., Bob Crowley of Saranac Lake, N.Y., and brakeman Philip Duprey of Raybrook, N.Y.—escaped serious injury.

Another American bobsled withdrew from competition after the accident. The third had not been scheduled to start because its pilot had the flu.

Mannheim outscored the Bearkats in the final period Friday 15-10, and again held the upper hand Saturday in the windup stanza, 23-17.

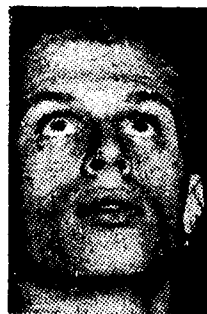
