

# Frankfurt, Baron, Knight Cagers Win

**NUERNBERG, Germany (Special)** — Steve Bari scored a total of 37 points, 20 Saturday as the Eagles squaked past Nuernberg 65-64 for a sweep of their two-game series opening the USDESEA Blue Division season.

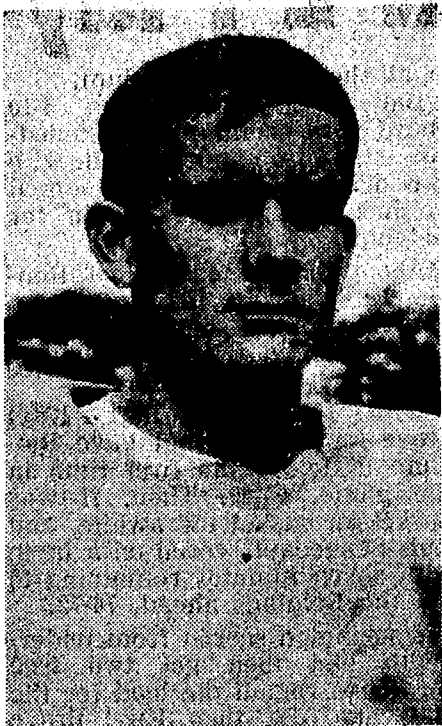
The Eagles won Friday's contest, 71-63 as five players hit in double figures.

Friday's game was decided in the last four minutes when fouls caught up with the tiring eagles, who pressed throughout.

Saturday Bari and Nuernberg's Cliff Stoeltje staged a scoring duel, the latter from close range. A missed free throw with three seconds remaining cost Nuernberg a chance to send the game into overtime.

Bari topped the winners both nights getting 17 Friday and his 20 Saturday. Others in double figures for Frankfurt Friday were Corrie Foos with 15, Ron Fischer 13, Greg Brown 12 and Tom Buros 10.

For Nuernberg, Gary Allison hit 16 Friday followed by Chester Alford with 15, Jay Mowery 13 and Walter Brown 12.



Steve Bari ... sparkles for Frankfurt

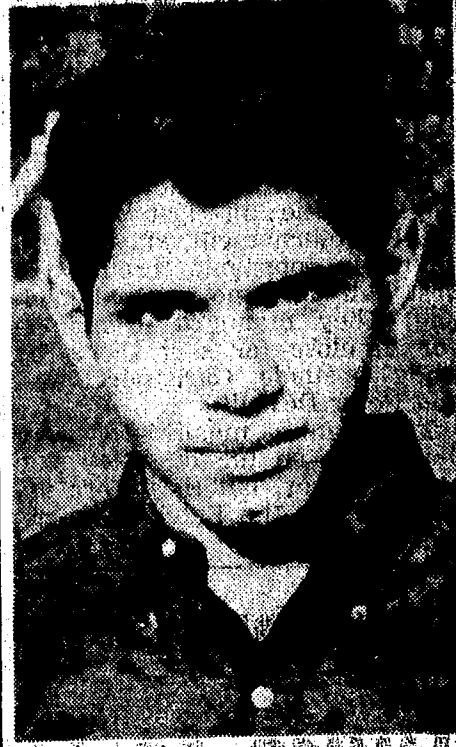
**BITBURG, Germany (Special)** The Bitburg Barons broke away from a 33-33 halftime tie with the Baumholder Bucs here Saturday for a 67-57 victory to complete a two-game sweep of their opening series in Red Division High School basketball play.

The Barons won Friday's opener, 56-44, behind Larry Bolster's 30-point effort.

The lead changed hands 10 times in the Saturday contest with the Bucs leading 42-37 after the intermission before three buckets by Bolster and one by Jerry Denton moved the Barons ahead for good at 45-42.

Bolster had 21 points for a 51-point total for the two games. Denton added 20 in the Saturday tilt. Bolster also dominated the boards in both of the games with 28 rebounds on Friday and 22 on Saturday.
