

# Heidelberg breezes and battles for wins

HEIDELBERG (Special) — The Heidelberg Lions breezed to an easy victory Friday night but they had to battle hard Saturday to post two Blue Division wins over the Bitburg Barons.

Heidelberg ran up 48 points in the first half Friday and coasted to a 64-43 win, but on Saturday the Lions needed a 25-point fourth period to register a 74-64 verdict.

Ed Hoyer's tremendous rebounding and feeds to the Lions for fast break baskets highlighted Friday's action. He had 16 rebounds and eight points, and Wayne Bardell and Steve Krejsa tallied 16 and 12 markers, respectively, to pace a nine-man scoring attack. Jerry Jackson was high for Bitburg with 26 points.

Abandoning their usual control-type game Saturday, the Barons decided to run with Heidelberg and kept pace — led for better than a half, in fact — until the Lions finally got their fast

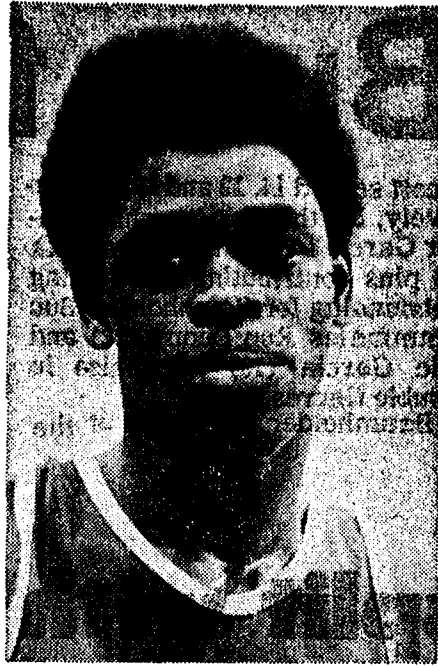
