

Lions tip Stallions twice to stay in Blue cage race

STUTT GART (Special) — Heidelberg won twice this weekend and kept things interesting in the Blue Division basketball race.

Dick Stewart's Lions posted an 85-70 victory over Stuttgart Friday and another 87-74 triumph 24 hours later.

That makes Heidelberg 8-2 in division play — tied with Wiesbaden — and sets up next week's showdown with Blue leader Kaiserslautern (9-1).

The double loss evened Stuttgart's record at 5-5.

Friday, the Lions' Ron Baskin did the Big D on All-Europe guard Ed Vojensky — holding the Stallion star to two points in the first half.

Vojensky wound up with 14 points — but Baskin's defense and Ed Hoyer's 23 rebounds proved to be the difference. Four more Lions joined Hoyer in twin digits, topped by Wayne Bardell's 21.

Steve Kresja added 19, Baskin 15, Hoyer 14 and John Konitzer 12 as the Lions blew out to a 20 point lead in the third quarter.

Dave Ganevsky led Stuttgart with a 23-point effort, 17 of those in the opening half. Jim Johnson and Ed Vojensky had 14 apiece and Meg Billings 13.

Bardell and Kresja were the big guns Saturday — combing for 45 points and 28 rebounds. Bardell matched Vojensky point-for-point in the first quarter, but the Lions pulled away with a 22-11 second period.

Again five Lions reached double figures — paced by Bardell's 23 and Kresja's 22. Vojensky gunned in 24 for Stuttgart with Jim Johnson adding 22 and Billings 17.

Wiesbaden takes Barons for pair

WIESBADEN (Special) — Wiesbaden swept a weekend basketball doubleheader from Bitburg, moving its Blue Division won-lost mark to 8-2.

Coach Paul Reeves' Warriors topped the Barons, 87-63, Friday and manufactured a "carbon copy" 84-69 win Saturday.

The double win kept the Warriors in a second place league tie with Heidelberg. For coach Bob Gaitten's Barons, the two setbacks were the ninth and tenth straight of the season.
