Hahn goes 9-0 with victory of Zwickau

ZWEIBRUECKEN AB, Germany — Unbeaten, untied and unprecedented.

The Hahn Hawks pulled their record to 9-0 with a 38-6 shellacking of Zwickau Saturday.

The Hawks, who clinched the regular-season title of the Continental Sports Conference last week, finished the regular campaign with the most victories in their 34 years of USAFE football. They open the playoffs Nov. 8 at home.

The Warriors went out at 2-7. Hahn led 16-0 at halftime, then let reserve quarterback Terry Zitzkovich take over.

The former USAFE championship signal-caller at Upper Heyford fired two touchdown passes and ran for another 22 yards to tight end Kurt Oxley. That capped a three-play, 60-yard drive and gave Hahn a 23-0 lead.

The Hawks came back with a five-play, 57-yard drive that Zitzkovich ended with a 37-yard pass to L.C. Baker. Orville Schumaker's fourth PAT kick made it 30-0 in the third quarter.

Zitzkovich sneaked over from the 1 with 9:37 left for a 36-0 spread.

Zweibruecken broke the shutout when Cal Walker hit James Williams with an 8-yard pass. But Walker was later penalized for intentional grounding from the end zone, handing Hahn a safety.

Oxley gave Hahn its first touchdown when he caught a 4-yarder from starting QB Mark Van Winkle 22 seconds into the second quarter.

The Hawks upped their lead to 9-0 when defensive end Dennis Lord blocked a punt out of the end zone for a safety.

Then Mark Jones barged in from the 1 with 36 seconds left in the half for the Hawks' 16-0 lead.

Zitzkovich clicked on six of 14 passes for 136 yards. Yul Taylor rushed for 86 yards and Jones 79 in Hahn's 315-yard ground attack.

Hahn held Zweibruecken to minus-27 yards rushing. Quarterback Ed Venable completed six of 18 passes for 69 yards.

Bitburg 23, Spaengdahlem 0

SPANGDAHLEM, Ab, Germany — A relentless wind, rain and Bitburg defense demolished the Spaengdahlem offensive and kicking game as the Barons blanked the Sabers.

Spaengdahlem, 3-6, managed only 23 net yards as the Barons leveled the Sabers' ground game to the tune of minus-45 yards rushing. The Sabers connected on seven of 24 passes for 68 yards.

The Barons, on the other hand, had their ground attack settled in deep. Bitburg, 7-2, rolled up 318 rushing yards on 59 attempts and added 32 more through the air.

Freddie Miller got things started for the Barons with 8:36 left in the first quarter when he bounced into the end zone from 5 yards out to cap a 50-yard drive set up by a wind-blown short punt. Miller ran in the two-pointer to give Bitburg the 8-0 lead it would take to the halftime dressing room.

A kicking-game failure set up the Barons' second game when Alvin Mack blocked a Spang punt to set Bitburg up at the Sabers' 12-yard line. One play later, Emmett Glover connected with Tracy Loibelle for a 10-yard TD strike.

Bitburg closed out the scoring in the fourth quarter with a 32-yard wind-aided Kenneth Evans field goal and a 9-yard TD run from Miller.

Wiesbaden 57, Rhein-Main 0

WIESBADEN — Usually when a quarterback controversy brews, the team suffers. But such is not the case with the Wiesbaden Flyers, who did well no matter who their field general was in their rout of Rhein-Main.

The Flyers finished 4-5, the Rockets 2-7. Tommy Thomas ran for two touchdowns and passed for another, and his backup, Mel Crandell, alternated

throughout the game and ran for one TD and passed for another. Both of Thomas' TD runs were 15-yard dashes; Crandell's run was a 3-yard bootleg.

Thomas' TD pass was for 15 yards to John Scott, and Crandell also hit Scott on a 21-yard scoring strike. Crandell set up his scoring toss with a 21-yard pass to Scott and a 20-yarder to Tim Sloan.

The Flyers' defense was not to be outdone by the Wiesbaden quarterbacking, as it generated 14 points. Martin Cox recovered a fumbled pitchout by the Rockets' Ben Fleming in the end zone for one score. Willie Spears hit Rhein-Main QB Jesse Smith to force a fumble out of the end zone for a safety, and the Flyers' Ken Gray blocked a punt that was recovered in the end zone by teammate Willie Gilbert for another score.

Wiesbaden's defense was hit for just 86 yards in the air by the downed Rockets, and also wet the fuse on the Rockets' running game, nabbing them for minus-64 yards rushing.

The only other Wiesbaden score came on a 5-yard run by Eric Godwin with 2:30 left in the game. That score was set up by a 37-yard pass from Crandell to Sloan.

The Wiesbaden offense generated 21 first downs on 295 yards rushing and 103 yards passing. Crandell was 5 of 12 for 107 yards; Thomas was 11 of 23 for 168 yards.
