LUDWIGSBURG, Germany, Sept. 26 (Special)—Eddie Strange passed for three touchdowns and ran for another one here Saturday to pace the Karlsruhe Knights to a 40-0 exhibition high school victory over the Ludwigsburg JV.

ing aerial to Don Padelford and he hit Bobby Cambre on 22 and 15-yard touchdown heaves. He scored on a 25-yard romp. Nolan Delcambre tallied on a six-yard run and Andy Foutes rumbled 29 yards with a pass interception for the other Karlsruhe scores, with Delcambre picking up four additional points on PAT jaunts.

Rick Alday and Henry Eyre excelled on defense for the Knights. Alday blocked three punts and intercepted a pass and Eyre was credited with eight tackles and several assists. Karlsruhe picked up 283 yards from scrimmage while limiting Ludwigsburg's young Stallions to a total of 30, all by rushing.

Lions Pounce On Raiders, 20-12

HEIDELBERG, Sept. 26 (S&S) The Heidelberg Lions recovered four fumbles and turned in a pair of key pass interceptions to knock off the Kaiserslautern Raiders, 20-12, in a high school exhibition game here Saturday that kicked off the 1966 football season for both teams.

The Lions, who yielded 300 yards and gained only 179, pulled from behind with a quick 56-yard touchdown drive with two minutes left in the first half and then shut out the Blue Division Raiders in the second half to open their campaign on a winning note.

It was 14-12 at halftime.

Heidelberg's go-ahead TD came on a 10-yard dash by Chip Cannon, who was the Red Division Lions' top-gainer on offense with 62 yards on 14 assignments. Tom Delaney made a sensational catch

on a 46-yard pass play from smooth-working quarterback Bill Tryon to set up the TD run for Cannon.

The Lions took the opening kickoff and drove 63 yards before

Raider Jim Nelson nailed Delaney with a hard tackle only two yards from paydirt on fourth down. A few seconds later 210-pound Lion tackle Harry Grindrod broke through the Raider line and picked off a fumble in the air to put Heidelberg on the scoreboard.

Delaney scooted over the right side of the big Raider forward wall for the extra points.

After a 48-yard pass play from Raider quarterback Scott Randolph to Ross Derby ended with a fumble deep in Lion territory late in the first period, the K-Towners came back with a pass interception by Bill Melear and then began to click.

Nelson hung onto a 23-yard pass

from Randolph for a Raider TD early in the second stanza. Randolph failed to connect on the conversion pass, but he reeled off runs of 28 and 12 yards and passed to Nelson for 44 before cracking over from the two for another K-Town TD a few minutes later.

Heidelberg scored in the first minute of the second half as Delaney pounced on a fumble by Joss Wright at the Raider six. Cannon picked up two yards and then Tryon hit Chuck Hutzler

with a pass to make it 20-12. The Raiders moved the ball well in the second half but the alert Lions were there to stop them when it counted. A long K-Town drive was halted at the Heidelberg 22 in the final minute of play when Hutzler intercepted a Randolph aerial.

The Lions, who had a 73-yard TD pass play from Tryon to Cannon called back in the first quarter, gained 80 of their 179 yards on four pass completions by their slick signal-caller. Randolph found the range on nine of his 24 passes for an even 200 yards. Wright, who was held to minus one yard on his last seven carries, was the top Raider ground gainer with 43 yards.

Delaney, Hutzler, Kevin Dugan and the Renlo brothers — Ken, Larry and Dick — starred on defense for the Lions, while the rugged Raider forward wall was headed by tackles Jim Beatty and Joe Kelley, line-backer John Dyas and ends George Simpson and Tom Riley.

Hodgdon, Eagles Clip Lancers in Prep Exhibition

LAKENHEATH, England, Sept. 26 (Special) — Matt Hodgdon threw two touchdown passes here Friday to lead the Frankfurt Eagles to a 14-0 high school ex-

hibition victory over the Lakenheath Lancers.

Hodgdon, who completed seven of 14 aerials including a 55-yard non-scoring toss to Ren Imer, flipped for 13 yards to Mike Schanzer to cap a 69-yard, seven-play series following the opening kickoff. Les Ashby started things rolling with a 38-yard run.

The defensive units took over until the fourth period when Hodgdon connected on a 12-yard aerial to Joe Caldwell. That drive originated on the Lakenheath 32 following a punt return of 28 yards by Ashby. Steve Smith converted by placement after both touchdowns.

AUGSBURG, Germany, Sept. 26 (Special)—The Livorno Lions scored in the final seconds of a close game here Saturday to defeat the Augsburg Apaches 12-6.

The game, played at Reese Casern Field, was marked by several costly Augsburg fumbles and an aerial attack by Livorno. The Lions were halted on their first series of downs, but an Augsburg fumble was turned into a touchdown as quarterback Mike Rios passed to end Mario Hilton from 30 yards out to make it 6-0 Livorno.

The rest of the half sea-sawed and the score at halftime was still 6-0. Augsburg caught fire in the second half of the exhibition game. Halfback Don Deal returned a punt 70 yards and then Frank Sharkey passed to his brother, Jim, and it was 6-6 when the conversion failed.

A third Augsburg fumble set up the final TD for Livorno. Fullback Joe Billington plunged from one yard out just as the final gun sounded to end the game, 12-6.

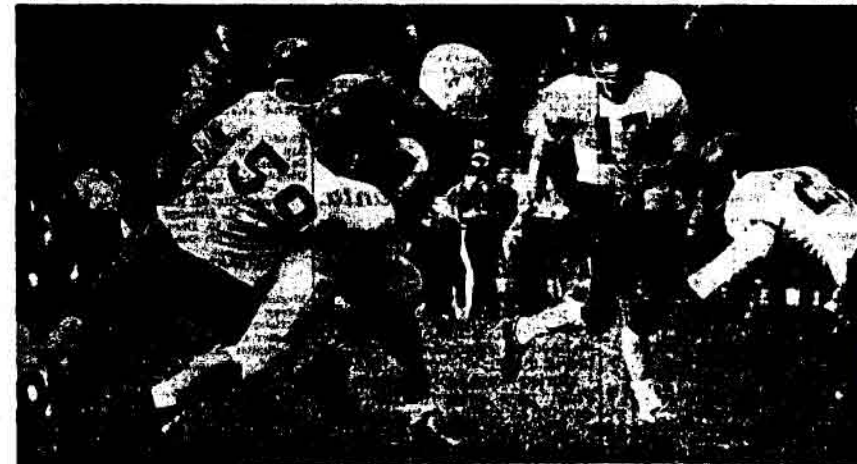
Nuernberg Golfers Overwhelm Wuerzburg

Vicenza Stuns Munich in Upset, 20-18

VICENZA, Italy, Sept. 26 (Special) — Explosive fullback George (Choo-Choo) Wargo led the underdog Vicenza Cougars to a shocking, 20-18, upset of the Munich Mustangs here Saturday in a USDESEA exhibition football game.

Wargo scored twice for the Cougars, who rallied from a 6-0 deficit in the opening quarter to take a 14-6 lead at halftime.

Wargo tied the score at 6-6 in the first period when he ran the ball 16 yards for a touchdown.

Kenny Mearns set up the second touchdown when he picked off a Munich pass and ran it back to the Mustang 10-yard-line. Two plays after that break halfback Richard Ducharme took a handoff from Rusty Hughes and went five yards to score. Quarterback Gene Farmer passed to end Dave Peters for the two-point conversion, making the score 14-6.

Capitalizing on another Mustang miscue the Cougars struck again early in the second half. Richard Smith recovered a Mus-

tang fumble on Munich's two-yard-line and Wargo crashed across from the one on second down.

Munich quarterback Bruce Dickinson almost passed the Cougars off the field in the final quarter, hitting Nut Howard on a 25-yard touchdown pass and, with three minutes left, nailing Dick Glover with a short scoring aerial.

Time ran out on the Mustangs when they in possession of the ball at the Vicenza 25-yard-line.
