## Orleans Nudges Paris In Cross-Country Meet

**ORLEANS, France, Nov. 1 (Special)**—The Orleans Trojans beat out the Paris Pirates for the 1964 France Regional team championship here Saturday, but cross-country squads from both schools qualified for the USDESEA championships at Ludwigsburg Saturday.

Orleans will compete for the Class B championship while

Paris will be gunning for the Class A title.

The Trojans won the team championship with 37 points. Paris (30), Drexel (22), London (96) and Verdun (102) trailed the leaders. Carlos Talamantez, Gary Smith, Jack King, Mike Reihaupt, Myles Standish and Walt Wright made up the winning team.

Will Rogers of Paris won the rugged race over 2 1/2 miles of muddy creek embankments, water, soft sand, embankments and a fence to cap individual laurels. Talamantez was second. He was followed by London's Ken Shoemaker, Paris' John Polcastro and Orleans' Smith.

**LONDON, Nov. 1 (Special)**—The Upper Heyford variety defeated the London junior varsity, 29-0, in a dual cross-country-meet here.

## Rota Subdues Madrid, 12-6; Bobcats Win

**TORREJON, Spain, Nov. 1 (Special)**—Jim Messner connected with Buzz Broughton on two scoring aerials to lead the Rota Admirals to a 12-6 victory over the Madrid Knights here Saturday.

The triumph boosted the Admirals into undisputed possession of first place in the Spain Conference and forced the Knights to win the final game of the season to earn a tie for the conference title.

The Admirals scored what proved to be the winning touchdown late in the fourth quarter when they took advantage of a key interception by linebacker Ralph Bink. Bink's interception gave the Admirals the ball on the Madrid 14-yard line and on third down, Messner hit Broughton with a swing pass. The elusive halfback got past two Knight tacklers and raced into the end zone with the winning tally.

Earlier, in the opening period, Rota launched a 75-yard touchdown drive which was culminated with Messner's pass to Broughton for the score.

Madrid's touchdown followed immediately after receiving the kickoff. The Knights covered 96 yards in 11 plays with Jim Kenyon bursting through for the tying tally.

**LONDON, Nov. 1 (Special)**—The London Bobcats used the combination of Lanny Anderson and Jimmy Andujar to roll to a 22-0 victory over the Verdun Falcons here Saturday.

Anderson scored once, passed for another TD and passed for both two-point conversions. Jimmy Andujar accounted for the other London touchdowns in the victory.

Andujar scored for the first Bobcat tally when he turned the right corner and rambled 16 yards to paydirt.

The London halfback then tallied the second TD when he caught an Anderson aerial in the end zone.

# 5 League Crowns Up for Grabs in Final Grid Games

**THE CURTAIN falls on USDESEA's 1964 football campaign Saturday with championship five of seven league titles undecided and only three of the 28 teams still sporting unblemished records.**

The unbeaten and untied teams are the Wiesbaden Warriors (8-0), Berlin Cubs (8-0) and Naples Wildcats (3-0). Wiesbaden could wrap up the Blue Division title when it closes out the season at home against the Munich Mustangs. Naples plays at Livorno with the SETAF crown already in the tank while the Silver Division champion Cubs travel to Bremerhaven.

In the only Friday game of the week, London plays at Lakenheath in a contest that will decide the U.K. championship.

Orleans plays host to the Paris Pirates in the France Division feature tilt. Paris is unbeaten in league play and the Trojans need to win to share the crown. A similar situation prevails in Spain, where Madrid needs a win at home against Seville to finish in a deadlock with Rota.

The unbeaten and once-tied Heidelberg Lions and Mannheim Bison look like sure bets to finish the Red Division in a deadlock for first place. The Lions travel to Billburg and the Bison play at Augsburg.

In other encounters Saturday, the schedule finds Frankfurt at Kaiserslautern, Nuernberg at Ludwigsburg, Wuerzburg at Baumhobler, Bad Kreuznach at Karlsruhe and Verdun at Drexel.
