

Frankfurt Blitzes Munich, 53-0, to Remain Unbeaten

MUNICH, Oct. 10 (Special) — The Frankfurt Eagles kept their 1966 record unblemished in a 53-0 victory by romping to a 53-0 lead on Oct. 10 in the Munich Mustangs in a high school Blue Division encounter.

The Eagles are undefeated, untied and on three outings, Saturday's win marked their 1966 conference debut in Munich in a 6-1 league play and 1-0 on the campaign.

Joe Caldwell scored twice for the Eagles and Don Lindsey, Bernie Smith, Les Ashby, Steve Smith, John Haupt and Bob Taylor all tallied once in the rout. Steve Smith also kicked three conversions and threw to Tom Klosterman for another. Caldwell's markers came on a 50-yard end sweep and a 60-yard punt return and Ashby broke

loose for a 65-yard scoring jaunt. Key blocks by Lindsey set up all three touchdowns. Taylor tallied on a seven-yarder, Bernie Smith plunged for five and Steve Smith a 14-yarder. Ashby scored on a three-yard drive. Haupt got his, marking on an intercepted pass.

Bearkats Kiss Off Bremerhaven On Cheeks' Two TD Runs, 14-8

BAD KREUZHAH, Germany, Oct. 10 (SAS) — Explosive Free Cheeks scored on runs of 53 and 28 yards to give the Bad Kreuzhahe a come-from-behind 14-8 victory over the presently unbeaten Bremerhaven Black Hawks in a Silver Division high school encounter here Saturday.

Coach Bryan Riggs' Bearkats, who had not scored while losing two games this season, wrapped up their first win with five minutes left on the clock as Cheeks shook off a half dozen Bremerhaven tacklers with a powerful 53-yard TD jaunt up the middle.

The Bearkats had pined even at 8-5 with four minutes left in the first half on a beautiful 28-yard romp over right tackle by Cheeks and a conversion run by workhorse fullback Andy Green.

But a 11-0 Bremerhaven pounce on three Bad K's fumbles in the opening period and turned on them into an 8-0 lead. The Black Hawks recovered the Bearkats' fumble at the Bearkats' 24. Cheeks' fumble at the Bearkats' 24 and halfback Jay Brett scored from the one five plays later. Bill Soose's run added two more points.

The Bearkats had picked up only one first down against the aggressive Black Hawks when Cheeks pulled off his 53-yard

late in the second quarter. The TD came on a second-and-10 play also, following a nine-yard punt and an offside penalty against Bad K's.

The Black Hawks, with quarterback Frank Raftery leading, got a 10-0 lead on a conversion run pass plays that went for 27 and 20 yards, moved to the Bad K four in the first quarter. Two straight losses dropped the visitors back to the eight, from where a fourth-down pass completion by Raftery won a winning 10-0 bounds on the right side of the end zone.

Green, a 6-2, 175-pound halfback, was at his best when returning kickoffs and punts. He set the Bearkats off with a fine 35-yard punt return.

Except for Cheeks' two long runs, the Bearkats offense was sputtering all the way. Sticking to the ground, Bad K never gained more than seven yards on 36 other rushing plays. Ten penalties—six of them five-yarder—kept the home outfit stalled.

Cheeks collected up 115 of which he gained 43 yards on 12 offensive maneuvers.

He also shared defensive honors with Proctor Palmer, Arnold Connor and Andy Gibson, led the Black Hawks with 58 yards on 11 carries. Fullback Palmer gained 42 yards and Hardy passed for 53 yards on 11 carries.

Bill Baird and Don Patrick, along with the ever present Green, were defensive standouts for the Bearkats.

Both teams are now 1-1 in league play.

Mannheim High Tops Bitburg For 3rd Straight

BITBURG, Germany, Oct. 10 (Special) — The Mannheim Bison led an intercepted pass and a blocked punt into touchdowns and defeated the Bitburg Barons, 20-8 here Saturday in a Red Division high school opener.

In registering its third victory of the season, Mannheim took the lead at the staff and marched to its first TD and then added six points in the second and fourth periods.

Bison quarterback Dennis Borchellor and halfback Zack Carter led the Mannheim attack.

Carter scored the first TD and Borchellor intercepted a Baron pass and led a 60-yard drive which he capped with a scoring run. Don Jackson tallied the extra point and Mannheim led, 14-0, at the half.

Borchellor hit on seven of 15 passes for 66 yards and ran 30 in 11 carries. Carter led the game's rushers with 64 yards in

15 tries. Mark Landon led the receivers with three catches.
