

Mannheim, Heidelberg Battle to 6-6 Tie

MANNHEIM, Germany, Oct. 17 (SAs)—The underdog Mannheim-Alton recovered four Heidelberg fumbles and turned the last one into a fourth-period touchdown to gain a 6-6 tie with the Lions here Saturday in a Red Division showdown that was viewed by more than 5,000 fans.

Both teams went into crucial combat with 3-0 overall records and 1-0 marks in league play.

Hard-throwing quarterback Dennis Borchler, a 150-pound

senior, tied it up for Mannheim on a three-yard plunge with five minutes left in the game. Halfback Tom Delany scored 16 yards on the last play of the first period for Heidelberg's six points.

Junior end Dave Schmalz recovered a Lion fumble 42 yards from paydirt to start Mannheim's scoring drive. Borchler connected with Tom Patton for 10 yards and the march was under way. Zach Carter reeled off 10 yards on three runs and Matt Anderson went for 17 and two to set up the TD for Borchler.

Carter tried to run and was the extra points but he was stopped cold by the likes of Gary Vesney, Chuck Baker, Kevin Dugan and Dick Renio.

The Lions' highly rated offense was slow getting started against the fired-up Bison. Heidelberg was showing minus seven yards in the total offensive department after 11 minutes of play.

A pass interception by Mike Devall late in the first quarter at the Lion 10-yard line set off the Lions. Chip Cannon carried the ball to the Mannheim 36 on a yard on the run and after quarterback Bill Tryon missed on a pass, Delany went the rest of the way on a quick-runner up the middle. Tryon was stopped inches short on an attempted quarterback sneak for the extra points.

Following the Mannheim TD, the Lions stayed in control of the ball the rest of the way. They

picked up four first downs on a steady drive that started on their own 32 and ended at the Mannheim 10-yard line.

Borchler turned in the defensive game of the day when he batted a pass on the Lions' last two hands in the end zone on the next-to-last play of the game.

Delany, Mannheim's top ground gainer with 67 yards on 11 carries, Carter picked up 28 and Don Jackson added 27 for the Bison.

Eagles Rally in 4th Period to Top Stallions, 26-13

LUDWIGSBURG, Germany, Oct. 17 (Special) — Frankfurt 17 Eagles had to come up with 20 points in a wild fourth period here Saturday to come from behind and defeat the Ludwigswig Stallions, 26-13, in Blue Division headliner.

The favored visitors were held to four first downs through the first three periods but found the range on the ground for five more in the fourth quarter while scoring three times on short runs.

The Eagles broke open a scoreless battle late in the second period when Steve Smith intercepted a Bill Park pass and returned it 18 yards for a touch-

down. The extra-point attempt failed and the score was 6-0 at halftime.

Ludwigswig evened the count in the third period on a 63-yard pass play with Park hitting James Ford on the long-range strike.

Cubs Trim Black Hawks With First-Half Flurry

BERLIN, Oct. 17 (Special) — The unbeaten Herin Cubs struck for 30 points in the opening half and then withstood a furious fourth-quarter rally by the Bremerhaven Black Hawks here Saturday to cop a 38-24 victory for their third straight Silver Division triumph.

The Cubs had a 22-0 lead at the end of the first quarter as Walter Slater fired two touchdown passes. Larry McCalley hauled in the first one, a 18-yarder, and Bob Posey later caught one for 14 yards.

Sandwiched between the two scoring aeriels was a five-yard TD run by John Spannos, who also blasted across from five yards in the second period.

Ed Posey collected the final Berlin touchdown in the fourth quarter when he ran five yards, a dayman ran across three two-point conversions and Slater

passed to McCalley for a fourth. Bremerhaven got on the scoreboard in the third quarter when Jerry Peele blasted one yard, in the final stanza, Frank Hardy unlimbered his passing arm and hit William Booner on scoring heaves of 25 and 35 yards. Hardy also plucked a yard for the other Bremerhaven touchdown.

London Tips Orleans, 24-18

ORLEANS, France, Oct. 17 (Special) — The London Bobcats, down 12-0 after the first quarter, came roaring back for a 24-18 victory over the Orleans Trojans in a high school exhibition game here Saturday.

The Bobcats scored 16 points in the second quarter to go ahead

but then had to rally from an 18-16 deficit in the final stanza to win on a TD pass from Kris Shaffer to Ken Jackson.

Cliff Bruce scored on a 63-yard romp and a one-yard plunge to give Orleans a quick lead. The Bobcats tallied in the second period of a 15-yard pass from Lanny Anderson to Jim Andujar, a 18-yard run by J. D. Mackie and a pair of conversion runs. Rich Johnson put the Trojans ahead again in the third period with a dive from the end zone.

The victory evened the Bobcats' record at 2-2. The Trojans now stand at 0-2-1.
