**BAUMHOLDER, G e r m a n y, Oct. 24 (Special)** — Zach Carter scored three touchdowns and gained 158 yards rushing to lead the Mannheim Bisons to a 10-5, 34-0, victory over the Baumholder Bucs here Saturday in the Division football game.
