# The Prep Scene Who Will Keep Heidelberg From Going Unbeaten?

NOT ONE of the 21 high school football teams in USDEUSA last year came through with an unbeaten and untied season. The current campaign is only two weeks old, but already the "perfect list" has been trimmed from 28 teams to 2. It is Heidelberg and the Nuerberg High Eagles to keep them from going all the way?

With the schedule as it is, the season will wind up with no more than four teams sporting unblemished records. The Heidelberg Lions of the Red Division are one of those teams at the moment. And, who's going to keep them from going all the way?

Able coached by Bud Korth, the Lions head into their Red loop schedule Saturday owning two impressive victory over teams from the big-school Blue Division. Led by hard-throwing quarterback Bill Tryon and the running of Chip Cannon and Tom Delaney, Heidelberg has knocked off Kaiserslautern, 20-13, and Ludwigberg, 24-8, in those two games. Tryon completed 15 of 33 passes for 392 yards and Cannon caught most of the aeriels in addition to picking up 117 yards on running assignments.

# CBS TV Obtains Rights To Pro Soccer Contests

NEW YORK, Oct. 4 (AP)—The CBS television network has signed a long-term multi-million dollar contract for the exclusive television broadcast rights of the games of the National Professional Soccer League, it was announced here today.

The NFLS has teams in 11 cities, with one more to be added. The league will begin its year with 18 games to be telecast live on Sunday afternoons, 12 on TV and 7 running through Sept. 3.

Both CBS and the NFLS refused to comment on their financial arrangements but financial details and length of contract were not disclosed. It was for two years, with options through 10 years.
