# Royals stamped Bison 41-14

MANNHEIM, Germany — Undefeated Ramstein rolled to a 34-0 third-quarter lead as quarterback Lance Koss sparked the Royal offense with two running touchdowns and one passing while cruising to a 41-14 win over the Mannheim Bison Saturday.

The win puts Ramstein at 6-0 in conference and 7-0 overall. Mannheim goes to 3-3 and 4-3.

Koss scored on a 1-yard run in the first quarter, followed with a 16-yard pass to tight end Brad Glosion, then ran in from 24 yards out to get the Royals express chugging.

Halfback Mike Ghent added to the lead with a 46-yard scoring sprint, fullback Chris Kelley climbed in from the 4-yard line and Tim Sailors connected on four point-after kicks for a 34-0 score.

Mannheim's offense produced two fourth-quarter scores. Quarterback Cory Jenkins tossed to Soli Letuligascenoa for an 11-yard strike and Nadi Leonard fugged one in from a yard out.

Jenkins followed the second TD with a 2-point running PAT for a 34-14 deficit, but Royals safety Jeff Barnhart nabbed a Jenkins pass later in the quarter and returned it 70 yards for a TD and Sailors converted for the 41-14 score.

Royals tailback Chris Blake failed to score, but led the offense with 122 rushing yards on 9 carries. Ghent was 8 for 107 and Koss 7 for 62. Koss added 62 yards passing on 5 completed passes on 9 attempts.

Leonard pounded out 84 yards on 23 carries for Mannheim.

### Heidelberg 14, Wiesbaden 0

WIESBADEN, Germany — Kelvin Leaphart's 18-yard interception return in the third quarter broke up a scoreless duel, and the Heidelberg Lions went on to post a 14-0 victory over Wiesbaden's Warriors Saturday in a battle for second place in the Germany AAA division.

Leaphart, a defensive back, had a clear shot to the end zone after grabbing Wiesbaden quarterback Richard Hipp's off-target swing pass 4 minutes into the third quarter. Kevin Hall added the PAT kick.

A perfectly thrown pass from Lions' quarterback Eric Zeier found Mike Davis between two Wiesbaden defenders and the 40-yard gain put the ball on the Warriors' 18 to set up Milo Bryant's two-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter. Hall added the PAT kick for the winners.

The victory enabled Heidelberg to finish 5-1 (5-2 overall) and second behind unbeaten Ramstein in the AAA standings. Wiesbaden wound up 4-2 and 4-3.

The Lions also had a substantial statistical edge, gaining 121 yards rushing and 148 passing. Zweier was

8-14-0 passing. Wiesbaden was held to 66 yards rushing and 31 passing on 2-8-2.

Monte Davis topped the Heidelberg rushing with 84 yards on 21 carries. Wiesbaden's Dwayne Anderson, who had averaged 100 yards plus for his last five games, was held to just 31 yards on 15 tries.

Clint Kirk topped the Lions defensively with 18 stops plus getting the other Heidelberg pass interception. He was supported by Lee Abarcrombie and Ron George with 10 and nine stops, respectively.

The Wiesbaden trio of Rod Neal (18) and linebackers Andy Lautvshier and Alex Franco (16 each) topped the losers defensively.

### Kaiserslautern 29, Frankfurt 20

KAISERSLAUTERN, Germany — A key tackle and a late touchdown pass clinched this battle of the basement for the Red Raiders. Kaiserslautern finished at 3-4 overall and 2-4 in AAA, averting a tie for the cellar with Frankfurt, 0-7 and 0-6.

Frankfurt nearly tied it in the fourth quarter. When Brian Howley tossed a 3-yard touchdown to Phi Nguyen, the Eagles had cut their gap to 22-20. They went for two points, but K-Town tackles Ken McClood and James Morrison made the hit to preserve the Raiders' lead.

K-Town quickly took it when Greg Hinds hit tight end Keith Luckett for a 16-yard touchdown and Damon Creech kicked the extra point with one minute left.

K-Town rode its special team to take a 6-0 lead in the first quarter. Dave Williams blocked a punt and Tom Manion returned it 20 yards for the touchdown.

OSTERHOLZ, Germany — The Osterholz Bearcats held off a heavy Berlin attack to win their first game of the season.

Through the third quarter, it looked like an Osterholz ball game as they were up 24-6. But, in the fourth, it looked like Berlin might take over and leave the Bearcats winless for the year.

Quarterback Shawn Steel led his team going 7-for-15 and 199 yards passing. That aerial attack came in handy in the last quarter as Ken Emerson scored TDs on a 37-yard pass and a 26-yard pass, while Lance Hamilton scored on a 63-yard pass from Steele. Hamilton and Steele also teamed up on a PAT to total 20 Steele-aided points in the last quarter.

Bearcats' QB Don Winfield scored on a 49-yard naked reverse and again on the run for the PAT and a 32-26 lead.

Berlin tried on a side kick, they recovered in and had a chance to tie the game with only 57 seconds to go. Winfield intercepted a Steele pass and shot down any hopes of the Bears gaining the lead.

Easier scoring for Osterholz came in a pair by Jay Williams with a 20-yard and 8-yard run. Ken Woofter ran in an 8-yard Winfield pass and Winfield kept the ball on a sneak for a 1-yard run.

Steele scored the Bears' only early points on a 1-yard run.

# Nuernberg clinches top spot

BAUMHOLDER, Germany — Freddie Headen scored three touchdowns to lead Nuernberg past Baumholder 26-6 as the Eagles clinched the No. 1 spot in AA Saturday.

Nuernberg, 6-1 overall and 5-1 in the league, will play AAA's second-place Heidelberg in the Big Schools semifinals next Saturday.

Headen got the Eagles rolling with a 1-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.

Headen came back to catch a 40-yard TD strike from Jesse Bruce. Pat McKinley's kick made it 13-0 in the first period.

Nuernberg's next touchdowns came in the third quarter: Terry Golden's 3-yard burst and Headen's 12-yard pass from Bruce.

Baumholder, 1-6 and 1-5, averted a shutout when Warren Hodge returned an interception 62 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Nuernberg rumbled for 286 yards on the ground and 131 in the air. Golden gained 156 yards in 16 carries and Headen 72 in six tries.

Felix Passi led a Nuernberg defense that held Baumholder to 176 yards rushing and 19 passing. Tim Johnson's 74 ground yards led the Bucs. Eddie Rhone made 12 tackles for the Bucs.

### Bitburg 42, Zweibruecken 0

ZWEIBRUECKEN AB, Germany — The Barons blanked the Trojans to finish with a 5-1 league record.

Like Nuernberg, Bitburg finished 5-1 in the league, but since the Eagles beat the Barons, Bitburg gets the AA second seed and will meet AAA champion Ramstein in the Big Schools semifinals Saturday.

Tyke Mix led the Barons' scoring, with touchdown runs of 9, 7 and 1 yards and a 70-yard pass completion from Cedric Jones, plus a successful 2-point conversion.

Halfback Vince Kelley scored on a 4-yard run and added a two-point PAT on a conversion pass from Jones. Kelley also booted two PATs.

Keith Warley rounded out the scoring on a 2-yard touchdown run.

The Trojans were plagued by injuries, with only 16 of their 32-man lineup able to play.

The Barons rushed 44 times for 209 yards. Jones completed 5 of 9 passes for 124 yards. Mix led the rushing, gaining 132 yards on 13 carries.

### Wuerzburg 28, Hanau 18

HANAU, Germany — The Wuerzburg Wolves knocked Hanau out of a

possible share of the Germany AA championship with a 14-point fourth quarter.

The Panthers, who entered the game in a three-way tie with Bitburg and Nuernberg for the conference lead with a 4-1 record, slipped into a deadlock at 4-2 with Wuerzburg in the final standings.

Ahead by only two going into the fourth quarter, Wuerzburg's Andre Still upped the margin as he ran 36 yards for the TD. A Jay Cash kick raised the score to 21-12.

But the Panthers persisted in putting on the heat. James Bussler scored on a 38-yard option play to bring Hanau within three points.

The Wolves found that margin too close for comfort and capitalized on a 16-yard run by Stacy Forte, followed by another Cash kick, to put them out of range.

The game's scoring began in the second quarter with a 35-yard touchdown run by Reggie Osborne.

Wuerzburg countered with Still 15-yard scoring run. The Wolves took the lead on Cash's kick for the PAT.

Forte gave the Wolves a more comfortable vantage point when he scored from the 1 after a 60-yard drive that took 16 plays. A Cash kick put them ahead 14-6.

The margin didn't last long as the Panthers' Bussler scored on the QB sneak from the 1.

# Walter's 3 TDs lead Stuttgart past Patch

STUTTGART — Off tackle runs were right on for the Stuttgart Stallions Saturday as Joel Walters took three of them for touchdowns and Mike Elmore cashed in another en route to a 33-7 win over the Patch Panthers.

Both teams went into the game with 1-5 overall records, but the Germany-AAA Stuttgart team proved tougher than the Germany-AA Patch team.

Walters picked up his first TD in the second quarter on a gallop of 35 yards on an off-tackle play and Pat Donovan toed the point after. Patch countered with Jeff Burritt hitting Joe Dawson with a 21-yard pass, and Jeff Cox tied the score at 7-7 with a PAT.

Walters struck again, this time with a

third-quarter, 4-yard off-tackle run for a 14-7 lead with Williams' kick, then boosted it to 20-7 in the third quarter on a 5-yard off-tackle run.

The Stallions turned to Mike Elmore for the next off-tackle and he carried in from 11 yards. Quarterback Chris Beecher capped the scoring with a 2-yard QB keeper and 33-7 win.

Walters ran up 118 yards on 13 tries for the Stallions who mounted a 244-yard ground game. Bill McHenry paced the Panthers with 62 yards on 16 carries to lead Patch's 119-yard ground attack.

Defensively, Stallion linebacker Roger Afalava had 12 tackles, eight assists and one fumble recovery; middle linebacker Walters had eight solos, eight assists, an

interception and two fumble recoveries; safety James Jennings picked off two passes and defensive lineman Jonathan Hill dropped eight and assisted in two tackles.

Patch linebacker Tim Bowman had six tackles and three assists.
