

# Boyd leads Spang past Rams

SPANGDAHLEM AB, Germany — C. Boyd barreled for 172 yards and two touchdowns to push Spangdahlem past Ramstein 35-12 in USAFE's Continental Sports Conference Saturday.

Boyd, the tailback from Texas, scored from the 2 in the first quarter and from the 8 in the final period to help the Sabers boost their record to 4-1. The Rams dropped to 3-2.

The Rams responded to Boyd's first TD with their only touchdowns for a 12-6 lead in the second quarter.

Quarterback Jeff Wilson passed for the first Ramstein score — a 43-yarder to C.A. Toomer. It came on a play after Wilson had been sacked by Mike Bell for a 7-yard loss.

Ramstein took its 12-6 edge by driving 57 yards in nine plays. Wilson took care of 31 of those yards with a pass to Toomer, who would finish with five catches for 121 yards. The big quarterback then rumbled 8 yards for the go-ahead touchdown.

Spangdahlem went ahead for good with 5:09 left in the half.

Sabers linebacker Bo Shelton recovered a Wilson fumble at the Rams' 24. Boyd rushed for 4, then Tony Bynum hit Willie Lawson for a 20-yard touchdown. Travis Allen, who was 3-for-3 on extra points, kicked

the PAT for a 14-12 Spangdahlem lead.

The Sabers made it 21-12 with 5:59 left in the third quarter. Bynum engineered an eight-play, 60-yard drive that he capped with an 8-yard TD toss to Michael Smith.

James totaled 87 yards to follow Boyd in a rushing attack that amassed 328 yards in 36 attempts. Marzell Hill helped out with 43 and Bynum 26 for the Sabers. Bynum also hit eight of 21 passes for 122 yards, with

Lawson catching six for 103.

Spang's defense — led by Shelton (two interceptions), Bell (two sacks), Mark Deprez, Ricky Hunt and Mike Tracey — held Ramstein to 54 yards on the ground. Michael Price led Ram rushers with 36.

Wilson completed nine of 24 for 189 yards. Reserve quarterback Chuck Herron hit six of seven for 25.

M.O. Lewis led Ramstein defenders with 14 solo tackles, two assists and one fumble recovery.

In the other CSC game Saturday: Rhein-Main 49, Soesterberg ORHEIN-MAIN AB, Germany — Gerald Fraylon passed for three touchdowns and Greg Booker scored twice on runs from the 3 and 4 to spark the Rockets.

Fraylon threw to Ed Mero from the 13, Kevin Beggs from the 4 and Herbert Coleman from the 6 as he completed nine of 22 passes for 134 yards. Dennis Williams scored from the 8 and Terry Smith from the 1 for Rhein-Main's other TDs.

Williams ran for 103 yards and Booker added 56, each on 14 carries, to lead Rhein-Main's ground attack. The Rockets piled up 222 yards on the ground.

Soesterberg couldn't mount any kind of an offense, finishing with only 2 yards rushing and 22 passing. End Chester Jones was the key Rocket on defense with nine solos and three assists.

Frankfurt's touchdowns came on a 1-yard run by Brian Hawley and Hawley's 23-yard pass to Phi Nguyen.

Leonard picked up 44 yards and scored from 4 yards out on the Bison's 65-yard drive on their first possession.

Later in the opening period, Corey Jenkins passed 14 yards to Travis Jenkins, capping a 66-yard march, and Brad Lengel booted the PAT for a 13-0 Mannheim lead.

Leonard reeled off a 56-yard TD run on the first play of the second quarter, and Lengel added the PAT for a 20-0 lead.

Mannheim opened its second-half offense with a 93-yard drive, capped by Gardner's touchdown romp.

In the fourth quarter, Corey Jenkins tallied from the 5 on a bootleg play, ending a 20-yard drive that was set up by a short punt.

After the Howley-Nguyen TD pass for the Eagles, Shane Floyd passed to Randy Robinson for the PAT and the final Frankfurt points.

Leonard gained his 182 yards in 32 carries. Gardner added 67 in seven attempts as the Bison amassed 320 rushing yards. They added just 44 yards passing.

Paced by linebacker Pete McDowell and tackle Kogo Letuligasenoa, Mannheim held Frankfurt to just 36 yards on the ground. The Eagles added 113 yards on 8-for-20 passing.

Youngblood had 14 tackles for the Eagles and linebacker David Taft and Howley, a linebacker-safety on defense, added 13 apiece.

# 'Golden' Eagles trim Lions

NUERNBERG — Nuernberg may want to change its team nickname from Eagles to Golden Eagles after Saturday's 26-7 dusting of the Heidelberg Lions.

The reason: running back-wide out Terry Golden.

Golden legged in a 42-yard touchdown in the opening quarter and snared two of quarterback Jesse Bruce's tosses for points to give the Eagles a 3-0 overall record while Heidelberg drops to 1-2.

Pat McKenley booted a point after on Golden's first TD, which came with 7:21 remaining in the quarter for a 7-0 lead with lasted four minutes.

The Lions came back with a TD from the feet of Brad Hogan from 11 yards out, and Kevin Hall booted the PAT.

Golden and Bruce connected with a 25-yard TD pass in the second quarter and followed with a 4-yarder in the third to mount a 19-7 lead.

The Eagles increased that lead to 26-7 when Victor Spencer carried in an interception from 15 yards and McKenley

Golden finished the day with 105 rushing yards and five receptions for 76 yards. Bruce hit 7 of 12 passes for 90 yards.

Zweibruecken 30, Patch 8

ZWEIBRUECKEN AB, Germany —

Eddie Simon caught two touchdowns from two quarterbacks to pace the Trojan\* to their first victory after two losses.

The Panthers are 0-3.

Simon's first TD catch, a 9-yarder from starting QB Mike Kenner, cut Zweibruecken's deficit to 8-6 in the third quarter.

Simon put the Trojans ahead to stay with a 34-yard reception of reserve QB Jeff Teumer's pass. Teumer, who replaced an injured Kenner, then ran for two points as Zweibruecken led 14-8 early in the fourth quarter.

The Trojans made it 22-8 on fullback Marc Colbert's 6-yard rush and Teumer's PAT pass to Corey Maness.

Zweibruecken's final TD came on Teumer's 25-yard strike to Jewel Bordon, followed by Teumer's PAT pass to Bordon.

Patch grabbed an 8-0 lead on Sean Frazier's 14-yard keeper in the second quarter.

Andre Coleman led Zweibruecken rushers with 118 yards in 19 carries. The Trojans totaled 193 on the ground and 153 in the air.

Patch rushed for 78 yards, with Joe Dawson picking up 70 in 11 carries. The Panthers added 61 passing.

Tony Alapati led the Trojans' defense with 11 tackles. Tim Bowman made 12 tackles for the Panthers.

Zweibruecken was flagged 10 times for 115 yards. Patch 16 times for 151.

### Bitburg 10, Wuerzburg 6

BITBURG, Germany — Cedric Jones continued his big production for Bitburg.

The Barons made sure Andre Still gained hardly any more for Wuerzburg.

The result: Bitburg hoisted its record to 2-0 in Germany AA and dropped Wuerzburg to 1-1.

Jones, the Barons' junior quarterback who accounted for three touchdowns last week, opened Saturday's scoring with a 60-yard dash and threw a touchdown pass. He led all rushers with 98 yards in 10 carries plus hit three of eight passes for 63 yards and kicked two extra points.

Still, the Wolves' junior tailback who amassed 318 yards and six TDs last week, was held to 4 yards in 11 carries by Bitburg, especially nose guard Bobby Williams.

The Barons took their 7-0 lead into the fourth quarter before finally building on it.

Bitburg then drove 74 yards, capped by Jones' 24-yard strike to Vince Kelley for a 13-0 lead with 9:40 left.

Still still had a touchdown in him. He bolted for a 3-yarder to cut Wuerzburg's deficit to 13-6 with 5:54 left.

Bitburg answered two minutes later. Tyke Mix took a pitch 5 yards to pay dirt and Jones kicked the point for the 20-6 lead.

The Barons rolled up 304 yards on the ground. Mix accounted for 92 and Kelley 86.

Mike Slifer gained 14 yards to lead a Wuerzburg rushing game that picked up 23 yards in 29 attempts.
