

Warriors Depth Difference in Track Meet

WIESBADEN (Special) — Wiesbaden's Warriors utilized superior depth to capture the crown in its own five team track meet here Saturday at Dykerhoff Stadium. Wiesbaden edged second place Frankfurt (90½-82) and the difference was third place. Both schools registered seven

first, but Frankfurt logged five seconds to the Warriors' four. But Wiesbaden latched onto seven thirds to the Eagles' two. Stuttgart finished a distant third with 53 points, followed by the Frankfurt International School with 15 points and Zweibruecken with 13½.

Coach Jim Elliott's unit featured a pair of double winners — John Jones in the 120-yard high and the 180-yard low hurdles and Tony Gunn in the long and triple jumps. Lloyd Morrow's Eagles took both relays and Rick Lovin got two firsts in the 800 and 1,500 meters.

Wiesbaden's other firsts went to Jerry Barnes — a tie with Zweibruecken's Ed Loy in the 100-meter dash — Andre Jones in the 400 meters and Jim Freeman in the 3,200 meters. Frankfurt posted three winners in the field events — Bruce Baker in the pole vault, Rich Cade in the shot put and

Mike Frost in the discus. Stuttgart and Frankfurt International managed one first apiece Saturday. The Stallions' Sid Seymour took the 200 meters and Lars Nagel of FIS triumphed in the high jump.
