

SHAPE, Heidelberg, Frankfurt Win Prep Tennis Crowns

LAKENHEATH, England (Special) — SHAPE's high school netters took a commanding victory in the Western Regional tennis championships here Saturday, winning first place in all but one category.

SHAPE led the field of six teams with 36 points. The Brussels Brigands grabbed second with 27, the Upper Heyford Hadesites were third with 18 and the host Lakenheath Lancers finished in fourth position with 17 points. The London Central Bobcats earned fifth place with 10 points and AFCENT's Vikings were unable to register any marks.

The Spartans' only defeat was in the boys doubles, but the duo of Chuck Gabriel and Steve Sailor managed to pick up points by taking fourth place in that event.

Keith Kaposta, SHAPE's undefeated singles star, remained unbeaten in the tourney by trouncing Mike Schwartz of Brussels, 6-2, 6-4, and Upper Heyford's George Kunberger, 6-1, 6-0.

Two-Set Victories

Spartan Ann Dunwoody took the girls singles with two-set victories over second-place Maxine Woods of Brussels, 6-2, 6-3, and Upper Heyford's Trina Jenkins, who finished third, 6-3, 6-2.

Wrapping up the regional crown for SHAPE was the doubles team of Dana Caldwell and Jane Gabriel. They needed three sets to turn back April Stover and Rhonda Suarez of Upper Heyford, 6-4, 1-6, 6-4, but put down London's Walker sisters — Lesley and Stacy — in two, winning 6-2 and 6-1.

In the boys doubles event, Lakenheath's Don Nasby and Richard Jones copped first place over Brussels' Pete Kennedy and Tony Matthews. The Lancer pair downed the Brigands, 6-2 and 6-0.

First- and second-place finishers of each event will represent the Western Region in the USDESEA finals scheduled to be played at Garmisch, Germany, May 14-16.

HEIDELBERG (Special) — Lynn Dicus of Karlsruhe pulled the year's biggest upset here Saturday when she beat Heidelberg's Dag Miles in the girls singles championship match, 7-5, 6-4, but the Lions still managed to walk off with their fifth straight Southern Regional tennis championship.

The charges of coach Tom Micket piled up 31 points to win the over-all title. The Munich

Mustangs finished second with 29 points. Karlsruhe scored 20 for third place. The Augsburg Apaches and Wuerzburg Wolves tied for fourth with 13 points and Stuttgart (12), Mannheim (8) and Nuernberg (7) trailed the leaders.

Miss Dicus' win over Dag Miles ended a 19-game win skein the defending regional and USDESEA girls singles champion had compiled.

Heidelberg's Evi Miles and Candy Heiss stayed undefeated by marching to the girls doubles title with a victory over Stuttgart's Christie Knutson and Pat Offenbacher and their victory, coupled with Dag Miles' second-place finish netted the Lions the girls title.

Munich took the boys crown with firsts in both the singles and doubles. John Feeney defeated Wuerzburg's Steve Blasinsgame, 6-4, 6-2, for the singles crown and the doubles team of Bill and Dave Byrd prevailed over the Heidelberg tandem of Steve Powers and Mike Roegge.

The first three placers in both the singles and doubles qualify

for the USDESEA championships starting Thursday at Garmisch. Augsburg had the third-place finisher in both singles divisions, Jamie Brown taking that position for the boys and Trishia Trotter qualifying for the girls' competition.

Mannheim's Paul Marangella and Jeff Kirk won the third-place slot in the boys doubles and Nuernberg's Diane Sharp and Allison Gundacker took the girls' berth in the championships.

Records Take Beating in Italy Track

LIVORNO, Italy (Special) — Six Records fell by the wayside and a seventh was tied here Saturday as the Vicenza Cougars won the American Schools in Italy track and field championships.

Steve Bench, Carl Rollins and Sam Wagner etched their names in the record book as the Cou-

gars racked up 101 points to win handily. The Naples Wildcats, getting a new record and a tie from Gary Mischler and a new mark from Bob Farquhar, finished second with 79 points.

Notre Dame's Kevin Bergfield set the other record as the Eagles took third with 65 points. The Overseas Falcons and host

Livorno Lions were far back with seven and four points, respectively.

Bench tossed the shot 49-13/4 for his record, while Rollins notched his with a 20-10 1/2 long jump and Wagner toured the 3200 meters in 10:21.7. Mischler set a record in the high hurdles with a 16.0 clocking and tied the 100 time of 11.1 and Farquhar broke the tape in the 1500 in 4:25.6 for his mark. Bergfield shattered the triple jump standard with a 41-4 1/2 effort.

Vicenza got other wins from Jim Newberg in the pole vault, Tom Bishop in the 800 meters and Skip Powers in the low hurdles and the Cougars also took both relays. Bergfield also won the high jump and Peter Popov notched Notre Dame's other win in the discus. Mischler added the blue ribbon in the 200 meters to his collection and Chip Taylor prevailed in the 400 for the Wildcats.

cars replacing Sims and Plummer, the 3200-meter team was quick to follow suit.

Frankfurt, although edging Wiesbaden, 10-9, in firsts and seconds, captured only two fourths and just one fifth in dropping 15 pivotal points to the Warriors. Bruce Loepcke was the Eagles' big scorer, winning both the high jump and the 180-yard low hurdles and taking second in the high hurdles, his first defeat of the year in that event.

Kaiserslautern picked up the bulk of its points in the 3200 meters and the pole vault. Howard Monceaux and George Sherman finished 1-2 in the distance event and Ron Pierce was good for fifth. Jeff Wright finished second only to brother Ralph in the pole vault.

Johnson was practically the whole show for Berlin, amassing 24 of the Cubs' 43 points. Oddly enough, his record-tying 22.2 in the 200 was not his best time of the year in that event, he having raced to a 22.1 at Berlin. His 50.4 in the 400, however, did eclipse his previous best by six-

tenths of a second.

Bernard Ford captured Baumholder's only first, racing to a victory in the 1500 meters. Bitburg's Barons were even less fortunate, managing to score just a fourth and four fifths for the day.
