

Stuttgart Cindermen Victorious

STUTTGART, Germany (Special) — A triple victory by Mike Porter led the host Stuttgart Stallions to an easy high school track win over Munich and Augsburg here Saturday.

Stuttgart captured nine of the 16 events in piling up 94 points, while Munich used its superior depth to top Augsburg, 51 to 26.

Porter captured the 120- and 180-yard hurdles events and the discus and added a second-place finish in the 100-meter run for the top performance of the day. Teammate Sid Seymour finished second in both the hurdles races, and then led a Stallion sweep of the triple jump with a leap of 40-4. He also ran a leg on the winning 800-meter relay team.

Other individual winners for Stuttgart were Riley Porter in the high jump, Mike Podurgal in the pole vault, Mike Anderson in the 1500, and Woody Peterson in the 3200.

Munich's Randy Wagner was the only other multiple winner, capturing both the 100 and 200 for two of the Mustangs' three firsts.

Johan Reynolds paced the Apaches' efforts with a victory in the 400 and ran the anchor leg on the 1600 relay team, while John Sturch in the shot put and Eddie Jordan in the 800 added the remainder of Augsburg's four firsts.

Frankfurt Thinclads Race to Prep Sweep

RHEIN-MAIN, Germany (Special) — Frankfurt's Jacob Brown and Bruce Loeppe each scored double wins and anchored a victorious relay team to lead the Eagles to an easy 96 1/2 to 51 1/2 conquest of the Kaiserslautern Red Raiders in a quadrangular high school track meet here Saturday.

Nuernberg and Frankfurt International trailed with eight and one points, respectively. Brown scored easy wins in his

specialties, the 100 and 200 meter runs, and ran the final lap for the 800 meter relay team, and Loeppe captured both the high and low hurdles events and anchored the successful 1600 relay squad. In addition, Brown placed third in the long jump and Loeppe was runner-up in the high jump.

The Eagles swept to triumphs in 11 of the 15 events, with other Frankfurt firsts coming from Leroy Crooks in the 800, Pat

Murphy in the high jump, George Holmes in the long jump, Larry Thompson in the triple jump and Wayne Crafton in the discus.

The Red Raiders, meanwhile, used victories by Pete Wallace in the 1500, Howard Monceaux in the 3200, and Mike Giese in the shot put plus good depth in the distance races and hurdles events for the majority of its scoring.

Rick McGee of Nuernberg captured the other first, racing to the 400-meter title, for the bulk of the Eagles' total, while Mahmut Bakay's fourth-place finish in the 100 gave Frankfurt International its lone point.

No pole vault competition was held, because construction of the vaulting pit has not been completed.

Vikings Rule 4-Team Track

BRUNSSUM, the Netherlands (Special) — Winning 12 events and getting a triple win from Vern Hargray and two firsts from Greg Payne, the AFCENT Vikings rolled to an easy victory in a quadrangular track meet here Saturday.

The Vikings piled up 115 2-3

points, almost beating the combined totals compiled by the SHAPE Spartans, Upper Heyford Hadites and Baumholder Bucs. SHAPE was second with 45 1/2 points; Upper Heyford tallied 41 5-6 and Baumholder finished with 37.

Hargray won all three of his

specialties — the long jump, triple jump and high jump. Payne won both the 100 and 200 meters and finished fourth in the long jump. He also ran the anchor leg in the 800-meter relay win.

Bernard Ford, Baumholder's middle distance man deluxe, won the 800 and 1500 meters for the day's only other double win and his times of 2:05.7 and 4:17.0, respectively, were quite impressive considering that the meet was held in most adverse weather conditions.

Steve Chandler took the 400 meters, Emilio Florez outlasted the field in the 3200, Dave Newell triumphed in the high hurdles and Don Tyner won the discus for AFCENT's other individual wins and Jerry Bernard, Newell, Chandler and Kent Heller teamed up to give the Vikings the 1600-meter event.

The slalom on Saturday, May 2, will be held at Coffey Barracks in Ludwigsburg with registration and inspection at 10 a.m. and racing to begin at noon. Classes will be according to the number of entries and trophies will be awarded for first, second and third place winners. Entry fee

is 15 DM for non-club members and 12 DM for members. Spectators will be admitted free.

On Sunday, May 10, the ONS slalom will get under way at Echterdingen air field (U.S. military side of Stuttgart Flughafen).
