

Maria Hesse Stars in Southern Net

HEIDELBERG (Special) — Maria Hesse, USDESEA runner-up last year, breezed to girls singles title to highlight Stuttgart's conquest of the team title in the Southern Regional tennis championship here Saturday.

The Stallions captured three firsts to snap Heidelberg's six-year skein as Southern champion.

Stuttgart finished with 37 team points to runnerup Munich's 26. Heidelberg was third with 24 and Mannheim fourth with 21. Others in order of finish were: Wuerzburg (11);

Augsburg (8); Karlsruhe (7) and Nuernberg (2).

Stuttgart won the girls team trophy and Heidelberg prevailed in the boys division.

Miss Hesse, a junior, defeated Mannheim's Connie Van Dyken, 6-1 and 6-0, to establish herself as the probable top-

seed in the USDESEA finals at Garmisch May 11-13.

Heidelberg's Bruce Steele, second seed in this tourney, bested Wuerzburg's Mike Zehner, the No. 1 seed, 4-6, 6-1 and 6-2, to win the boys singles crown.

The Stallions grabbed both

doubles titles.

Hugh Pendergrass and Bruce Davis, the regional favorites, turned back Munich's second-seeded Jeff Anjo and Ardan Devine, 6-2 and 7-5. In girls play, Stuttgart's Trish Skelly and Suzanne Patrick, seeded second, turned the tables on Munich's Donna LaBelle and Bev Vahinger, top-seeded, winning 7-5, 2-6, and 8-6.

The top three finishers in each bracket earned a trip to Garmisch and a shot at the USDESEA titles.

The Mannheim boys duo and the Augsburg's girls doubles team nabbed third place under the tournament "double jeopardy" rule. Both teams defeated their opponents — in this case Heidelberg — in earlier rounds and were declared automatic winners in the finals.

Kaiserslautern Nabs Three Titles To Dominate Tennis Action in North

LANDSTUHL, Germany (Special) — Kaiserslautern's powerful Red Raiders grabbed three of the four individual titles to easily take team honors in the Northern Regional tennis championships here Saturday.

Unbeaten Cliff Edson won the boys singles, Trish Green the girls singles and the duo of Bob Bain and Ron Nicholas the boys doubles as the K-Towners racked up 45 out of a possible 48 first-place points.

The Red Raiders failed only in the girls doubles where Frankfurt's undefeated Karen Johnson and Janet Pierce soundly whipped Adie Scott and Lorie Pitts, 6-2, 6-0

But with the top three in each event going on to the USDESEA finals May 11-13 at Garmisch, Kaiserslautern had no trouble in qualifying all six members of its varsity squad.

Coach Dave Geyer credited his team's success to installation of an indoor court at Kaiserslautern earlier this

year. "It gave us a lot of extra practice, which showed in this tournament," he said.

Second to the Red Raiders was Frankfurt, last year's team champion, with 27 points. Wiesbaden, with 17, finished third.

Naples, Vicenza Romp In Italy Track Meets

LIVORNO, Italy (Special) — Naples and Vicenza romped to victories in a triangular and dual track meets, respectively, here Saturday.

Naples with 118 points far outdistanced second-place Livorno which had 27 points. Third was Overseas of Rome with 15. The Vicenza Cougars tallied 95 points to 44 for Notre Dame School Rome in the dual meet.

The Cougars' premier relay teams, already owners of the best season marks, lowered their best times in both the 800 and 1600.

The 800 foursome of Dave Winn, Dave Jones, Cliff St. George and Ron June logged a time of 1 minute, 31.9 seconds — nine-tenths of a second faster than the year's previous best.

The 1600-meter relay team of Jesse Daniels, St. George, Jones and Winn clipped almost two seconds off their top time of the year. They recorded a 3:31.2 — 1.9 seconds quicker than the old mark.

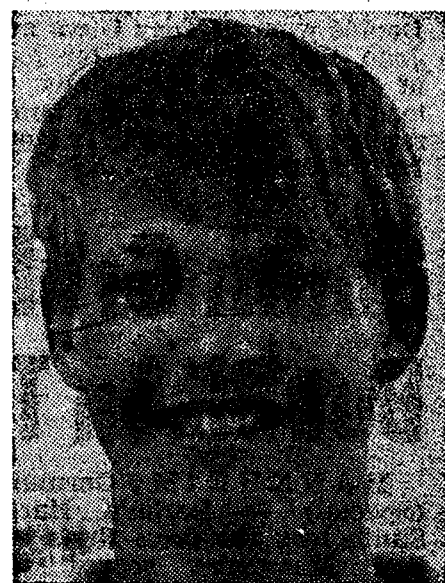
In addition, Vicenza got three firsts from June and two each from Daniels, Greg Abramo and Bill Sullivan.

Livorno's Monica Chini captured the girls singles laurels with a 6-1, 6-0 triumph over Vicenza's Annetta Dexter. The girls doubles crown went to Vicenza's Tricia Dugan and Andrea Sciolla who beat the Livorno duo of Theresa Hadley and Barbie Waldron, 6-1, 3-6, 6-2.

All champions advance to the USDESEA championships, scheduled for May 11-13.

Friedman finished second to Livorno's Phil Chino in the boys singles as a sophomore and won last year's title by beating Bitburg's Tom Neaves, 6-1, 6-0.
