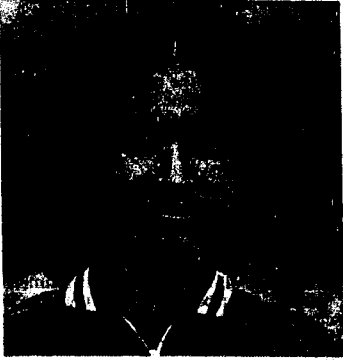


Beluex tennis championships

Oyloe wins 3rd title, ruins Brussels' sweep



Bonn's Carrie Oyloe ... third singles title

BONN — Carrie Oyloe of Bonn gave the hometown fans something to cheer about as she captured the women's singles title while Brussels' Jackie LaBerge and Karen Logan grabbed the doubles honors to highlight the Beluex tennis regionals Friday and Saturday here.

Oyloe, who had won two Beluex crowns previously, chalked up her third title with 6-2, 6-2 wins over AFCENT's Margot Farber in the championship match. Farber, who captured the Spain women's singles as a sophomore, was runnerup last year in the Beluex singles.

Brussels' LaBerge, who was last year's Beluex singles champion, switched to the doubles this year and teamed with Logan to edge Bonn's Jennifer Lukowski and Cathy Myers, 6-3, 7-6, for first-place laurels.

Brussels, which gathered team honors with 37 points while AFCENT took second with 30, sewed up two more first places in

the men's singles and doubles.

Kurtis Derrell gave the Brigands a win in the singles when he eliminated Bremerhaven's Mike Finnell in the finale, 6-2, 6-4. Derrell advanced to the championship game after defeating ISB's Mike McLaughlin, 6-1, 6-0, and SHAPE's Paul Northrop, 6-4, 7-6.

John Roth and Jack Grymes teamed to give Brussels the men's doubles title. The pair gained the honors after beating AFCENT's Bob Burger and Scott Dorris, 6-1, 6-4.

Roth-Grymes knocked off Hahn's Bob

Nolan-Thomas Ozgo 6-1, 6-0, and then ISB's Kevin Moore-John Seildorff 6-2, 6-1, to make it to the finals against Burger-Dorris, who posted wins over Bremerhaven's Charles Dobson-John Schreivoegel and Doug and David Schweitzer of Bad Kreuznach.

Oyloe, who netted impressive victories en route to the singles titles with wins over Brussels' Carla Reverse and ISB's Lesley Morrison, helped Bonn take the women's trophy, although the whole team finished the tournament with 23 points for third place. The Brigands took the men's trophy.

In the final team standings, Bremerhaven ended fourth with 16, SHAPE and ISB tied for fifth with 13, while Bad Kreuznach and Hahn deadlocked for sixth with one point each.

Kaiserslautern's Springle, White, Wiesbaden's Gober star in track

KAISERSLAUTERN, Germany — Wiesbaden's Jane Gober and Kaiserslautern's Carl Springle and Glen White all figured in four wins here Saturday in the Kaiserslautern Invitational track and field meet.

The Wiesbaden women and Kaiserslautern men breezed to the victory to remain undefeated going into the Germany Regionals, scheduled Thursday, Friday and Saturday at Frankfurt's Wald Stadion. Wiesbaden scored 108 1/2 points to win the women's competition and the Kaiserslautern men totaled 114 in the pentagonal meet.

Gober took the 80-yard hurdles in 10.8, one-tenth of a second below her own DODDSEUR record. She also won the 200 meters in 26.8 and ran legs in the winning 400 and 800-meter relays.

Springle won the men's 100, 200 and 400 meters, turning the later in 50.0, matching his own season-best time. Springle also ran the lead leg in the 400-meter relay.

White triumphed in both hurdles and ran the anchor legs in the 400 and 800 relays. He hit the tape in 14.9 in the highs, by far the best time of the season, and he turned the lows in 20.0, also the best of the year.

The 400-relay team of Springle, David Tresville, Dennis Canada and White was timed in 41.8, another best time. The Wiesbaden women and men also had season-best efforts in the 400 and 1600-meter relays, respectively.

The women's combo of Lynn Pride, Elizabeth McEady, Elizabeth Shoaff and Pat Boston turned the 400 in 51.5 and the men's foursome of Joe Gober, Guy Jemison, Darryl Horne and Dave Coniglio were clocked in 3:33.2.

Wiesbaden's Alicia Wrice and Kaiserslautern's Brenda Lewis also posted impressive double wins. Wrice won the 50 meters in 6.9 and then took the 100 in 11.9.

the best of the year and only one-tenth of a second off the DODDSEUR mark. Lewis won the 400 meters in 59.2 and the 800 in 2:20.7.

Kaiserslautern's David Harpster continued to improve in the pole vault, hitting a personal and season topper of 13 feet, one-half inch and anau's Don White walked off with both the weights.
