

Barons' Smith involved in 3 marks

Bitburg sparks record onslaught in qualifying meet at Heidelberg

What a day Bob Galtens' Bitburg Barons enjoyed Saturday at the Heidelberg qualifying competition for this week's Germany track and field championships.

Seven DODDSEUR records fell in that meet and another tumbled in the Munich eliminations as Germany's elite qualified for the finals at Munich Friday and Saturday in three regionals — and Bitburg athletes etched their names opposite four events.

Baron Ken Smith was the most productive competitor, getting his name on the logs in three different events. He turned in a 10.53 hundred meters, to break the old mark of 10.6 which had been originally set in 1963 by Kaiserslautern's Clyde Wooten and matched three times since. He ran the third leg of the 400-meter relay and the lead leg on the sprint medley as the Barons created DODDSEUR marks in both of those events, too.

Baron Ken Smith was the most productive competitor, getting his name on the logs in three different events. He turned in a 10.53 hundred meters, to break the old mark of 10.6 which had been originally set in 1963 by Kaiserslautern's Clyde Wooten and matched three times since. He ran the third leg of the 400-meter relay and the lead leg on the sprint medley as the Barons created DODDSEUR marks in both of those events, too.

Tony McEwen, Charles Henry and Kevin Jungling teamed with Smith in a 43.88 time that broke the record of 43.7 set by Kaiserslautern two years ago. Smith, Jungling, Sheldon Stokes and Craig Wertz lugged the baton to a 3:38.85 clocking in the sprint medley. The 3:42.7 time the Kaiserslautern combo of Greg Pritchard, Todd Scott, Rocky Rice and Allen Mueller turned in also was under the old record of 3:44.7 Karlsruhe established last year.

The other Bitburg record-setting hero was Alan Jankunas, Germany individual champion in cross-country last fall and undefeated star this spring in the 3000 meters. It was in that grueling race that Jankunas put his name in the book. He had an 8:56.15 time to erase the one-year-old standard of 8:56.6 set by Sigonella's Tim Bolton.

Jankunas also had a year's best 4:07.55 time in the 1500 meters and finished second in the 800 meters.

Kaiserslautern's Alonzo Babers and Linda McDuffy and Mannheim's Pat Boston cracked the other DODDSEUR records on the splendid turf of the Schwetzingen track.

Babers sizzled to a 21.68 time in the boys 200-meter race, clipping over a second off

Meanwhile, down in the Munich regional, Sabrina Dornhöfer did it again!

The tiny Würzburg sophomore broke her own record in the girls 3000-meter run by a sensational 24.7 seconds. Dornhöfer, who gave a hint of things to come when she ran a 10:49 in the last regular-season meet, left the rest of the field far in her wake with a 10:38.2 clocking.

She won the 1500, too, but her time in that race was somewhat off her best previous effort because she was concentrating on the 3000 record.

Other 1979 honor-roll bests in the Heidelberg-hosted meet were turned in by Zweibrücken's Colleen Prather, Kaiserslautern's Bruce Bennett, Kent Minich and Bob Porter and by the K-Town boys 1600-meter relay team.

Prather ran the girls 800 in 2:25.13, Bennett had a 15.39 high hurdles time, Minich cruised over the intermediates in 40.11 seconds and Porter went 6-6 in the high jump. Rice, Scott, Minich and Babers teamed up for a 3:27.27 clocking in the boys 1600.

Two season-best marks fell in the Munich regional. Munich's John Karp heaved the discus 152 feet, three-fourths of an inch and Munich's Betsy Paul and Nürnberg's Corrine Salinas turned in identical times of 60.6 in their heats of the girls 400.

Over at Baumholder, on a slower track, Wiesbaden's girls lowered the time in both the sprint medley and the 1600 relay. Shaun Byrd, Gloria Smith, Mona Goldstein and Dee Dee Brown churned the 1600 in 4:16.2 after LaCreda Wren Byrd, Brown and Gretchen Alkerhuis had won the former in 4:34.4.

the old mark of 21.8 set by London's Graydon Walsh in the 1973 Europe-wide championships. Babers also won the 400 meters with a season-best time of 48.85.

McDuffy bettered the discus record by 14 inches and Boston, who already holds the DODDSEUR long jump record with an 18-5 mark, erased the triple jump record by almost a foot. McDuffy hit 126-3 with the platter; Frankfurt's Jackie Phillips set the old record of 125-1 three years ago. Boston scratched Upper Heyford star Angela Gray's record of 36-7 1/2 off the books by recording a 37-6 1/2 effort and also had a season-best 18-3 1/4 mark in the long jump.
