

# Distance star

Sabrina Dornhofer, the defending Germany Regional 1500 and 3000 meter champion, proved Saturday that she will be the girl to beat again this year in the championships when she turned in two more glittering performances in her specialties in the Ansbach quadrangular.

The Würzburg sophomore ran the 3,000 meters in a sensational 10:49.0, almost 10 seconds under the DODDSEUR record-setting performance she turned in last May in the rain at Zweibrücken. Her time that day was 10:58.9. She had run a 11-minute flat race last week.

Earlier Saturday, Dornhofer had turned in a 5:02.3 clocking in the 1500 meters, also bettering the best time of the year of 5:04.8 which she turned in two weeks ago.

Because DODDSEUR records can be established only in official DODDSEUR in-country regional championships or preliminaries, Dornhofer's mark cannot be recognized as official. However, she gets chance to change the record book in both events this weekend and next at Munich which hosts one of the three qualifying meets this Saturday and the Germany championships May 19-19. Other qualifying meets will be staged at Baumholder and Heidelberg.

Rota's Kim Potter, Kaiserslautern's Linda McDuffy, the Bitburg 400-meter relay team and the Wiesbaden sprint medley teams all bettered 1979 marks and Hanau's Darcey Meissner tied one in the girls competition over the weekend while Rota's Mark Alexander and Baumholder's Tony Tolson topped season-best and Baumholder's Wes Samuel matched the 11.6 clock turned in by Kaiserslautern's Erwin Stone.

in a triangular at Torrejon, bettering the previous 8-3 efforts turned in by Kaiserslautern's Robert Porter and Stuttgart's Dave Woodruff. Tolson took three-tenths of a second off the finest 200 intermediate hurdle time of the year with a 41.5 clocking at Hahn.

While she didn't better any times or distances, Bulord enjoyed another good day at Hahn, winning the 100 in 12.6, the 200 in 21.6 and the triple jump with a 33-4¾ effort. Samuel added the 200 to his 100 win. Bonn's Tommy Rittenhouse and Hahn's Frank Watley also posted double wins in a meet in which the 3000 meters and 1600-meter relay were cancelled because of snowstorms — on Derby Day, the first Saturday in May yet! Rittenhouse took the triple jump and pole vault and Watley hit 6-2 in the high jump and also won the shot put.

Bitburg's Alan Janikas turned in a couple more fine performances in the 1500 and 3000 meters, just missing his own 1979 marks in both categories. He was only two-tenths of a second off in each event, hitting the tape in 4:12.0 in the 1500 and in 9:10.4 in the 2200.

Kaiserslautern's Kent Munich, who made his high hurdles debut a week ago and had competed only once in the intermediates before that, continued to show a liking for the new events. He took the highs at Heidelberg with a 15.8 clocking, slightly off the season-best effort he turned in in his inaugural, and the 300-meter intermediate with a 42.1 time.

## U.S. women rip Japanese in world cage meet

SEOUL (AP) — The favored U.S. team downed Japan, 84-64 Monday for its second victory against one loss in the final round of the World Women's Basketball Championships here.

This was the second setback against one victory for the Japanese girls, who now have little hope of staying in contention.

The American girls, silver medalists in the 1976 Montreal Olympics, were paled by Carol Blazejowski and Rosie Walker, who contributed 16 points each.

In earlier games, the U.S. women beat Italy Sunday, 84-64, after losing to the host Koreans in their final-round opener last Friday.

Canada won over France, 72-59, Sunday for its third win against no losses to remain the front-runner. France is 0-3.

Paced by Lidia Goblin, who accounted for 19 points, the Italians tied Sunday's game with the U.S. four times, the last time eight minutes before the final whistle.
