

Stallions, Barons Post Easy Wins

Seymour Nabs 3 Firsts in Triangular

STUTTGART (Special) — Stuttgart's Stallions galloped to the title in their own track triangular here Saturday, notching nine firsts and out-running Zweibruecken and Karlsruhe.

Stuttgart rolled up 86½ points in its triumph — ahead of the Trojans' 47 and Knights' 36½.

Versatile Sid Seymour took three firsts for the Stallions in the 200 meters, the 400 meters and the 120-yard high hurdles.

Roland Arnold and Dan Cornwall were the only other individual double winners Saturday.

Arnold starred in the 100 meter dash and the triple jump for the Stallions while Cornwall was No. 1 in the middle distance events — the 800 and 1500 meters — for Zweibruecken.

Karlsruhe latched onto three firsts — Eric Smith in the 180-yard low hurdles, Rod Smith in the high jump and Chuck Buckholder in the shot put.

Bill Ausmus, Teasley Lead Bitburg Romp

BONN (Special) — Bitburg aces Bill Teasley and Bill Ausmus turned in their best efforts of the season here Saturday to spark the Barons to a one-sided track victory.

Bitburg, racking up 11 firsts and scoring in all 15 events, finished with 98 points, easily topping the four other schools.

Far behind the Barons were the combined units from Brussels and Brussels International with 32 points. Host Bonn had 29, followed by AFCENT with 12.

Teasley, the Barons' fine long distance runner, bettered his own season marks in flashing to firsts in the 800 and 1500 meters. His time of 2:00.5 in the 800 was the lowest recorded this season, bettering the 2:00.7 of Heidelberg's Dave Tharp. Teasley posted a 4:08.2 in the 1500, 4.3 seconds faster than his previous best this year. Bitburg's John Burdian finished second in both races.

Teammate Ausmus likewise enjoyed his finest day of the season. The Baron weightman better his own seasonal mark of 49 feet, 10 inches in the shot put, with a heave of 50-1½. He also turned in a fine effort in the discus, hitting 137-1½.

Also turning in fine performances were Bonn's Ken Chavis and Steve Jackson of Bitburg.

Chavis, a double-winner for the Crusaders, chalked up his best mark this season in the triple jump, winning that event with a 42-7 3-8. He also took first in the long jump with a 20-1 leap.

Jackson's time of 52.7 in the 500 was his fastest this year and earned him a spot on Prep Pickin's honor roll.
