

Mustangs Sweep Pair; Gwodzik Pumps In 50

MUNICH (Special) — Dave Gwodzik scored 50 points here Saturday night as the Munich Mustangs completed a two-game sweep over the Vicenza Cougars in non-conference high school basketball games.

Munich opened its season activities with an 82-65 verdict Friday and the USDESEA Class A champions followed up that win with a 92-69 triumph on Saturday.

Gwodzik made 19 field goals and 12 free throws for his 50 markers. Corby Bright added 17 and Mike Crisp chipped in with 10 for the Mustangs. Bright scored 25 points and Gwodzik garnered 24 in Friday's win.

Chuck Fix was the big gun for Vicenza both nights. He scored 35 points Saturday after a 25-point effort on Friday. Don Martin scored 18 and Walt Wynn added 12 to the Vicenza cause Friday, but Fix was the only Cougar able to crack double figures on Saturday.

Brinkman Snares Garmisch Xmas All-Events Crown

GARMISCH, Germany (Special) — Don Brinkman of Rhein-Main averaged better than 206 over nine games to win the all-events championship in the 13th annual Garmisch pre-Christmas scratch bowling tournament.

Brinkman rolled 675 in the team competition, 625 in doubles and 558 in singles to take the championship with 1858. The 675 was the highest series in the tournament.

Bill Wetherington of Heidelberg was second in the all-events with 1780 and Glyn Rollins of the Vicenza ATAF No. 1 team was third with 1769.

The Vicenza ATAF No. 1 team, paced by Rollins' 659 set, took the team title with a 2346 score.

Benvenuti, Fullmer Not Expecting Repeat

ROME (AP) — This time there should be no excuses and fewer banana peels.

In Saturday's 15-round world middleweight title fight in San Remo between Nino Benvenuti, champion and darling of the Italian ring, and crewcut Don Fullmer of Utah, much will be different from the last Benvenuti-Fullmer meeting.

That fight ended in a controversial 12-round decision for Benvenuti before a screaming, fruit-throwing crowd of 18,000 in Rome's Palazzo Dello Sport in February 1966.

The Italian referee and sole judge agreed with Nino that the tough Utah Mormon was butting with his head. Frequently the referee stopped the fight to warn Fullmer about head work. The warnings weighed heavily in the point tally.

Fullmer and his manager, Angelo Curley, contend Fullmer was not taking unfair advantage with his head and that every time the referee halted the match, he made the American out as the villain, encouraging volleys of fruit and a chorus of boos.

"They must be great fruit eaters here," said Fullmer after he arrived for the title crack. "They were heaving everything — oranges, apples, bananas — even pizzas."

It would be a notable feat if Fullmer carries out his plan to put Benvenuti down for the count. The chunky Italian has never been knocked out in 80 encounters, and has been floored only three times, twice by Emile Grif-fith.

Benvenuti said he thought the fight would go all 15 rounds and that he would outclass Fullmer to win.

"Now that I have behind me the three encounters with Grif-fith (in which Benvenuti won, then lost, then won the title), I have enormous experience," he said.

He repeated his assertion that

Fullmer was out to hurt with the head butt in '66 and he expects more of the same Saturday.

"In Rome (in 1966)," Benvenuti added, "Fullmer said that body who climbed into a with him was able to touch nose. Well, I made his nose as a tomato."

Both training camps report their boys in top condition at the 160-pound weight limit.

Win or lose, Benvenuti is planning on temporarily trading his gloves for six-guns after about. He was to go to Spain the filming of an Italian "Western," "Vivio o Preferibilm Morti" (Alive or Preferred Dead).

Ace Flanker, Defender Key West Shrine Squad

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Stanford's record-breaking pass catcher, Gene Huey, and a trio of All-America defensive aces head the West squad chosen for the 44th annual Shrine Game Dec. 28.

Four Associated Press first-team All-America selections were on the 28-man squad announced Sunday by Shrine Game officials.

Washington, running from a flanker's spot, rewrote Pacific-8 pass-catching records this season for Stanford.

He'll be on the receiving end of tosses from quarterback Brooks Dawson of Texas-El Paso, and Ronnie Johnson of Oklahoma State.

A trio of AP All-Americans, middle guard Ed White of California, tackle Joe Greene of North Texas State and back Al Worley of Washington, head the West's defensive unit.

The only honor squad selection on the offensive unit is center John Didion of Oregon State.

Keying the ground attack will be Bill "Earthquake" Enyart, 230-pound Oregon State full-back, Halfback Louis "Speedy"

Thomas of Utah and fleet flanker Gene Huey of Wyoming along with Washington, command the power of Enyart, 225-pound fullback Jack Stewart of Texas Tech.

Besides Worley, White, Greene, the West defense includes a pair of Rocky Mountain area linebackers, Jim House of Wyoming and Ron Pritchard of Arizona State, an AP second-team All-America pick.
