

Karamursel Cage, Mat Teams Top Izmir Twice

KARAMURSEL, Turkey (Special) — The Karamursel Cougars opened their American Schools in Turkey League winter competition on a successful note here over the weekend by taking two basketball and wrestling wins from the Izmir Sultans.

Bob Sund tossed in 68 points — 25 on Friday and 43 the next day — to lead the Cougars to 60-45 and 89-33 triumphs on the hardwoods. Karamursel is now 2-0 on the campaign while Izmir leveled off at 2-2.

Sund threw in 12 field goals and a single free throw Friday in notching his 25 points, but that was only a warmup for things to come on Saturday. The 6-4, smooth-working senior tallied 15 times from the field

and hit on 13 of 17 from the free throw line to turn in the season's top individual performance.

Tony Britton was high for Izmir Friday with 23 points but Karamursel held him in check Saturday, limiting him to eight markers as Mike Sala topped the visitors with 10 points.

Meanwhile, on the mats, it was Karamursel taking 29-21 and 33-25 triumphs. Both days it built up an early lead, fell back in the middle weights and then took the last two matches by default to notch the victories.

Raoul Van Galotos, Hal Mitchell and Eddie Rodriguez each won two matches for the Cougars while Izmir got double victories from Aaron Harvey,

Jim Garcia, Rock McGee and Keely Lyons — the latter two via the pin route.

SHAPE Whips Lions As Furmanek Sparkles

SHAPE, Belgium (Special) — The SHAPE Spartans bounced into the Western Division prep basketball win column here Friday and Saturday by taking a pair of verdicts from the AFCENT Lions.

Danny Furmanek paced the Spartans to both triumphs, getting 18 points in Friday's 83-39 win and 22 on Saturday as SHAPE posted a 72-42 conquest.

The Spartans ran up a 35-14 halftime lead on Friday and then scored 24 points in each of the last two periods as 10 of the 11 players coach Jerry Bisson used broke into the scoring column. John Murphy and Kevin O'Sullivan joined Furmanek in double figures with

12 and 10 points, respectively. Ryan DuPont paced AFCENT with 11.

AFCENT stayed close for a quarter on Saturday, but SHAPE scored 30 points in the second period to break the game wide open. Ten Spartans scored in that game, too, but Cory Young was the only one besides Furmanek in twin digits. He had 11.

John Heggerty led AFCENT in scoring with 16 points and Leonard Harvey came through with 12.

SHAPE now stands at 2-2 in Western Division strife while AFCENT has dropped three straight games after opening with a victory.

SHAPE's JV also won twice, 42-31 on Friday and 40-21 the next day.

Shane Fails in Bid For 6th Swim Mark

SYDNEY (UPI) — Australia's wonder girl swimmer, Shane Gould, missed her sixth world record Sunday night when she failed to beat the time established by American Claudia Kolb in 1968 for the 400 meters medley.

Miss Gould's time of 5 minutes, 7.4 seconds was 2.7 seconds short of the record 5:04.7 established by Miss Kolb.

Miss Kolb has since retired from swimming.

The 15-year-old Sydney school girl hoped for another world record after her brilliant 58.5 seconds in the 100 meter free style Saturday.

First to Check In

TOKYO (UPI) — Canada's 10-member bobsled team arrived Saturday to become the first foreign athletes to check in for the 1972 winter Olympics. The Canadian group will leave Tokyo Tuesday for Sapporo, where the Games open Feb. 3.

Duvillard Takes Cup Lead With Slalom Triumph

BERCHTESGADEN, Germany (UPI) — Henri Duvillard, a burly 23-year-old Frenchman from Megeve, Sunday took the world cup lead with a special slalom victory at the Gold Cup Alpine ski races that saw 60 out of 88 skiers drop out for missing gates or taking spills.

Duvillard, starting from the second seed, was only fourth with 49.45 seconds after the first heat. But in a second run through the 67-gate course he clocked 49.91 for a total of 1 minute, 39.36 seconds, edging West Germany's Max Rieger

1:39.49, and first heat leader Andrzej Bachleda of Poland 1:39.89.

Duvillard, not regarded as a leading slalom specialist, tops the World Cup standings after five events of the 21-race series with 49 points.

World slalom champion Jean-Noel Augert of France, who fell victim Sunday to the extremely tough and icy course at the fourth gate of the first run, shares second spot with Austria downhiller Heini Messner at 40 points.

The best any of six American skiers could do was a tie for ninth place by 19-year-old Terry Palmer from Kearsarge, N.H., in 1:42.65.

His more experienced brother Tyler, winner of the Sestriere, Italy, World Cup slalom, last month and in ninth place after the first heat, had a sensational best of 49.02 seconds for second run that would have made him the winner at 1:39.22.

He missed a gate, however, but it took the jury some time to confirm his disqualification. Hank Kashiwa from Old Forge, N.Y., was 14th in the listed field of 28 and the only other American to finish.

Diplomat Given Award By NCAA

HOLLYWOOD, Fla. (AP) — Dr. Jerome H. "Bud" Holland, the United States ambassador to Sweden, has been presented the Theodore Roosevelt Award, the National Collegiate Athletic Association's highest individual honor.

The award is given each year to a prominent American "for whom competitive athletics in college and attention to physical well being thereafter have been important factors in a distinguished career and achievement."

Dr. Holland starred in football as an end at Cornell University in 1937-8-9 and is a member of the National Football Hall of Fame. He served as president of Delaware State College from 1953-60 and Hampton Institute from 1960-70.

ZWEIBRUECKEN, Germany (Special) — The Bitburg Barons grabbed two victories and the Zweibruecken Trojans and Baumholder Bucs each notched one here over the weekend as five teams got together for a high school wrestling show.
