Upper Heyford Takes Class B Laurels

Frankfurt Matmen Rule USDESEA Tourney

WIESBADEN (S&S) - Record-setting Frankfurt made shambles out of the 1972 US-D T S E A wrestling cham-

pionships here Saturday.
Art McCoy's Eagles qualified seven men for the title match and six of them came through with championships — both achievements shattering records set by the 1966 Ludwigsburg team which had six men in the finals and took home four first-place trophies.

Frankfurt racked up 96 points - getting a third in addition to its six firsts and a second — to overwhelm its Class A rivals. Lakenheath, making the strongest showing ever of a U.K. and Western Division team finished second with 44 points. Wiesbaden finished third with 35 and Kaiserslautern and Heidelberg rounded out the top five with

and 32, respectively.

In Class B, U.K. and Western Division strength dominated with the Upper Heyford Hadites taking the laurels with 29½ points. Zweibruecken was second with 24 and Karlsruhe was third with 23½. Augsburg and Wuerzburg shared fourth and Wuerzburg shared fourth place with 17.

Kit Kash, one of two 1971 champions to win in 1972, got Frankfurt its first championship in the 105-pound class and Ed Huddle (112), Frank Giannola (138), Al St. Amour

(145) and Steve Cooke (155) wrapped up championships before Frankfurt lost a title match.

And Mike Frick's 1-0 loss to Upper Heyford's Rick Hubbard certainly was no disgrace. Hubbard, a runner-up at 175 last year, was acclaimed the outstanding wrestler in the tournament by a vote of the coaches following the competition. Rich Cade wrapped up Frankfurt's sixth crown by recording the only pin of the championship round in the last match on the card.

Bitburg was the only team to join Frankfurt in the multiple winners bracket. The Barons' Rick Hart took the 98-pound title and Wayne Duncan prevailed at 185.

Wuerzburg's Mike Jennings racked up his second straight USDESEA championship to join Kash in repeater's row. The third 1971 cham-

pion trying for a repeat was Torrejon's Spike Bandli but he was foiled when he lost a semifinal bout to Alan Baird of Kaiserslautern. Jennings beat Baird in the 119 showdown to complete a season approaching perfection. He won 16 matches and didn't allow a single point. His current two-year win skein stands at 32.

Kaisers'autern's Rich Heaser (126) and Stuttgart's Bob Porter (132) won the other Munich's Bryan Murphy and Giannola and St. Amour needed extra time to preserve unbeaten 1972 ecords with wins over Karlsruhe's Dan Howard and Berlin's Larry Garrels, respectively. Porter's and St. Amour's came on referee's decisions while Gian-nola picked up three points in his triumph. Porter and Cooke came out of the rat tails of the non-

titles. Porter's win started a

string of three straight over-

time battles. He prevailed over

seeded to win their championships. Porter was seeded eighth and Cooke was an even more less respectable 10th. Porter knocked off first-seeded Bob Nadeau and second-seeded Murphy en route to his glory.

Karlsruhe qualified only three men for the championships but the Knights were stil in the title picture when the championship round got underway. They needed third place wins from Greg Furst, Frank Picherchero and a title triumph from Howard.

The Knights also needed both of Upper Heyford's finalists, Hubbard and Gary Verble to lose. They needed a minor miracle but only Picherchero was able to come through.

Thirty schools competed in the championships and all but AFCENT and Livorno managed to get a point on the scoreboard.
