

# Lions Score 22 Points In Last Period to End 22-Game Winless Skein

LIVORNO, Italy (Special) — Livorno's Lions, taking out the frustration of a 22-game non-winning streak, roared for 22 points in the final quarter to chew up the Augsburg JV, 28-8, in their opening game here Saturday.

The Lions, who had tied Naples in 1966 and Vicenza in 1967, had not won a game since 1966 when they went 2-1-1. After going 0-3-1 in 1967, they suffered 16 straight set-

backs before Saturday's win. Down 8-6 after three quarters, the Lions exploded for three touchdowns in the final period. Tony Ridings' four-yard run put Livorno ahead to stay, but the Livorno weren't about to stop there.

Bob Wilsie broke a 63-yard touchdown run and quarterback Randy Rousseau hooked up with Steve Zglinicki on a 61-yard scoring play for the final margin of victory.

Luis Rodriguez's spectacular 74-yard touchdown run and two-point PAT had put the young Apaches ahead, 8-0, in the first period.

UPPER HEYFORD, England (Special) — Upper Heyford's Hadites, stunned by a 60-yard touchdown pass from Jay Hicks to Milt Wells on the second play of the game, bounced back to down the London Bobcats, 14-8, in a U.K. Division game here Saturday.

Quarterback Mike Andresen set up one Hadite touchdown on a 25-yard pass to George Bonds and threw 20 yards to Kevin Gray for the winning TD as the Hadites boosted their conference record to 1-1 and their over-all mark to 2-1.

London is now winless in two games.

Down 8-0 after the first period, Andresen got the Hadites moving in the second period, Bonds making a great catch of the big 25-yard pass. Andresen later ran the ball over from the three then ran for the tying PAT.
